Our old copy machine was turned in off lease after we printed last month's

newsletter. Just today the new multifunction machine was delivered. Although it will not print color, we should have a better looking newsletter because of the laser print quality and the ability to print pictures if we like. It will also create PDF files that can be emailed to members and opened and printed using the free Acrobat Reader program. This may give us an alternate to printing and mailing the newsletter for those who may be interested.

Nominations for 2004 Club Officers will be opened at the October and November meetings. I know that there will be at least a few positions open, so be sure to let someone know if you would like to become more involved in the club operations next year. Included in this issue are descriptions of the duties of each officer. They can also be found in your copy of the Club By-Laws.

The deadline for renewals of club dues are approaching. Dues need to be paid earlier this year to avoid the NCCC \$10 late fee. A renewal form can be found in this issue. We will also try to have a form put on the club website.

Thanks for cooperating with me to make last month's meeting more organized and efficient. I received some positive comments about the use of the PA system, so we will continue to use it.

#### **Club Officer Duties**

Nominations for club officers will be open at the October and November General Membership meetings. Below I have outlined the main responsibilities and duties of each office. Please consider running for one or more of these positions if you are interested in helping out. All positions are for a term of one year. Election of officers will take place at the December 4<sup>th</sup> meeting/dinner.

**President** - The President is responsible to preside over all general membership and board meetings. He/she should be able to attend most club functions, especially those which involve the public. He/she will is ultimately responsible to coordinate the operations and direction of the club. He/she is required to have held at least one club office prior to running for President.

Competition Director - The Competition Director is responsible for coordinating all competition events sponsored by the club. Typical duties include arranging dates and locations for events such as our annual autocross event at Spartan Speedway. He/she is also responsible to select the year-end awards for the Top Ten in the points standings. He/she is expected to attend the Michigan Region meetings and report back to the membership. Currently there are five meetings per year, and they are held at Richard's in Lansing the Tuesday evening before the scheduled NCCC Governors meetings. He/she is ultimately responsible for the points program. He/she will serve as the Club's Vice President and take over the duties of the President in his/her absence. Michigan Region event flyers are sent to the Competition Director and should be made available to the editor for inclusion in the newsletter.

**Governor** - The Governor is the club's link to NCCC. He/she will receive correspondence from NCCC and distribute it to the appropriate club officer. He/she is encouraged to attend NCCC Governors meetings which occur five times per year. Currently four are held in St. Louis, Missouri, and the other is held at the NCCC Convention. (The meeting location could change to Nashville, Tennessee, in the future.) The club reimburses the Governor for most expenses for attending the meetings.

**Secretary** - The Secretary is responsible to record the minutes and votes of all club meetings. He/she is responsible to provide a copy of all minutes to the editor for publication in the newsletter.

**Treasurer** - The Treasurer is responsible for keeping the financial records of the club, making payments of all club debts, and making bank deposits. A report of the financial activity of the club is to be made available or presented at the club meetings.

**Membership Director** - The Membership Director is in charge of promoting the club at events and recruiting new members. He/she will handle the paperwork involved in enrolling new members and processing renewals. He/she will also handle the promotional items given out by the club and NCCC. He/she is responsible for keeping an accurate membership list and providing that list to the editor at least twice a year for publication in the newsletter.

**Social Director** - The Social Director is in charge of coordinating or finding people to host all club social events. He/she will select and reserve a location to hold the annual club banquet. If a member would like to host a social event, it is the Social Director who checks for availability of dates on the club calendar before bringing the request to the Board.

**Editor** - The Editor is responsible for the production of the monthly newsletter. This involves gathering reports and articles, copying, assembling, and mailing the newsletter. The club leases a copy machine for newsletter production, which is kept at the editor's home. He/she is essentially the club "print shop" when copies of flyers and copies of other club information is needed. Knowledge of and access to computers if very helpful, if not essential, to be successful.

**Public Relations Director** - The Public Relations Director is responsible to help represent the club to the media, businesses, and the general public. He/she is encouraged to find advertisers for the newsletter, handle club sponsorship communications, and generally promote the club in a positive way.

**Points Director** - The Points Director is responsible for keeping track of member points totals and printing or presenting a monthly report. He/she will answer questions from members regarding the points program. Knowledge of spreadsheet software is helpful but not necessarily required to assist him/her in the job.

#### CCCC BOARD MEETING MINUTES SEPTEMBER 17, 2003

SECRETARY: No report.

<u>PUBLIC RELATIONS</u>: Simon stated he "just hopes to get back into the swing of things now that he's feeling better."

<u>MEMBERSHIP</u>: Membership numbers remain the same. We need to remind all members renewal dues are due no later than November 5th. We need to allow time to forward all renewals to National and avoid a club late fee.

SOCIAL: Hayride at the Hutton's September 27th, MSU Homecoming arranged by John & Janyce Shepler October 4th, Color Tour hosted by Don & Carol Armstrong October 11th, Mexican Train at the Johnston's November 1st, Holiday Dinner at the Maynard's December 3rd, and the Annual Banquet January 24th at Mountain Jacks.

POINTS: Point status to date is available on the Web site.

TREASURER: Despite the questionable weather, the zoo show was a success! Only have 33 shirts left, of which the zoo has agreed to purchase. Overall profit from the T-shirts, 50/50, and car registration exceeded last year's, so donation to the zoo will be near \$3,000. Motion was made and passed for the club to donate the difference, and plan to make the check presentation to Carol Webster at the October meeting. Phil noted per his calculations: 40% of the cars in the show were Corvettes, 23% won trophies, and they received an overall vote of 29%. We were all very pleased with the diversification of awards.

EDITOR: October newsletter deadline is September 24th.

COMPETITION: No report.

<u>GOVERNOR</u>: Region meeting was September 9th, and the NCCC Governors meeting was September 13th. There are some region by-law changes, one of which includes the position of Secretary/Treasurer now being separated into two offices.

PRESIDENT: No report.

<u>OLD BUSINESS</u>: Phil invited Jeff Mitzel to the Board Meeting. Jeff had done considerable research on our copier/printer dilemma. Costs of using an outside printer vs. purchasing a printer, color or black and white, and annual costs involved were discussed. Final recommendation, based on the club's needs was: HP LASER JET MODEL 3320 MFP. Motion was made and unanimously approved for purchase. Jeff M. and Phil will finalize place of purchase.

<u>NEW BUSINESS</u>: Phil talked about the Chicago Vette Fest in November. He will bring up at the next general membership meeting, thinking maybe a group would like to go.

MEMBER INPUT: In further discussion of the zoo show, Jeff questioned whether we should continue. He noted it is a tremendous amount of work and a heavy weight on a few people. Maybe we should consider retaining a portion of the 50/50 for the club's account. Other ideas: need to be better organzied, obviously having a chairperson would help, and form committees, park Vettes in the back, and fill the front with other vehicles.
