GOVERNOR: Next regional meeting is May 4th.

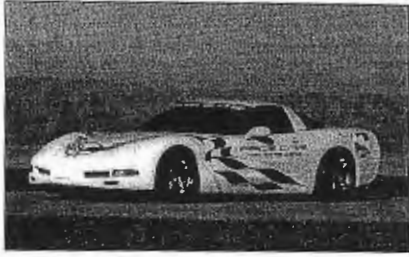
PRESIDENT: Simon provided Board Members a 'Horsepower at the Zoo' Sponsor/letter spreadsheet with contact status and all pertinent information.

All master members should have received a rulebook (pages to be inserted into a half size 3-ring binder) in their original membership packet from NCCC. Any updates to the book are available by sending in a form included with the NCCC renewal packets each year. If you are new to the club and don't have a rulebook yet, call or email me to let me know, and I will work something out.

The Flint Corvette Club is hosting its annual Corvette Show on May 15th followed by the Charlton Park Corvette Celebration by the Corvette Club of Battle Creek on May 16th. Our club will be caravanning to the Charlton Park show. See the flyer for more information about this. Even though there is no organized caravan to the Flint show, I'm sure a number of our members will be attending. I'll try to get an idea of who is planning on attending so that you can travel together if you like.
