From the President...

Greetings!

Well, here it is October already. Did we have summer, or did I miss it? The weeks sure seem to go by fast.

It just seems to be getting better and better every year. There were about 140 cars entered in the show. I'm not sure how much money we raised for the zoo yet since all the figures aren't in. I do think everyone enjoyed themselves though.

Our next big club event is our fall color tour on October 9. Last year we had a real good time cruising the back roads of our wonderful state with all the fall colors that we can enjoy this time of the year in Michigan. I'm sure there will be a sign up sheet at the general membership meeting. If you can't make the meeting, but want to attend this event, you can contact Don and Carol Armstrong. I know they have a great day all planned for us, complete with turn-by-turn directions in case anyone gets separated from the group. First and foremost, be sure to wash and put a good coat of wax on it before putting a cover on it. (Gloria says she would be ecstatic if anyone feels led to put a coat of wax on mine before she puts it into storage.)

I always put six mill plastic under the car to protect it from moisture coming up through the garage floor. I also stick a few pieces of carpet under the car for added protection, and to absorb any leaks.

I also like to change the oil, fill the gas tank and add some dry-gas, or some sort of gas stabilizer, to the gas tank for the winter. Oh, and make sure you drive the car a short distance afterward you add it so that it moves into the gas line. You folks with the C4's and newer cars might want disconnect the battery, or put on some sort of battery tender, so your battery doesn't die on you over the winter.

Before I forget, don't forget to attend this month's general membership meeting on October 6. At this meeting, and the one in November, we will be accepting nominations for board positions for 2005. I want to encourage anyone who interested in running to get your name out there. We distributed job descriptions at last month's meeting. 


