TREASURER: Bob gave the monthly report. Gary Wyma made a motion to pay all of the February bills. Motion seconded and passed. Capital City Corvette Club Competition Program 2005

Purpose: The purpose of the CCCC Competition Points Program is to encourage and reward members for participating in NCCC Sanctioned Events.

- 1. **Eligible Events** All events sanctioned by the National Council of Corvette Clubs (NCCC) will be eligible.
- 2. **Annual Awards** The competition season will run from January 1, 2005 through December 31, 2005. Awards will be presented at the annual CCCC awards banquet.
- 3. **Awards Categories** The following are the categories for which awards will be offered:
 - a. **Men's Overall** Highest Men's award and goes to the individual with the highest number of total points.
 - b. **Women's Overall** Highest women's award and goes to the individual with the highest number of total points.
 - c. **Men's Rookie of the Year** Goes to the individual who accumulates the most overall points and begins the year in Novice class in the speed events. Must participate in minimum of one speed event to qualify.
 - d. **Women's Rookie of the Year** Goes to the individual who accumulates the most overall points and begins the year in Novice class in the speed events. Must participate in minimum of one speed event to qualify.
 - e. 1st Place Show/Concours
 - f. 2nd Place Show/Concours
 - g. 1st Place Rallye
 - h. 2nd Place Rallye
 - i. Men's Speed Champion
 - j. Women's Speed Champion
- 4. **Awards Order** No individual can win more than one award. If the overall men's or women's top points champion is also the rookie of the year then the Rookie of the Year award will go to the second place finisher. In the event of a first place tie in either the Show or Rallye category the second place award will be eliminated and two first place awards will be awarded.
- 5. **Member Responsibility** If a member participates in a NCCC sanctioned event outside of the Region (Michigan) it is their responsibility to provide the Competition Director with a copy of the event sheet results.
- 6. **Points Values** Points will be those awarded from the event sheet in accordance with NCCC Guidelines.
- 7. **Ineligible Members** For 2005 the Competition Director (Kurt Schwamberger) and Sharon Schwamberger per their request.

The Competition Program is subject to review and revision at the end of each competition season.

CCCC Social Points Program:

The points program was created several years ago to encourage participation in the club. Club events could be anything from a Drive'n Dine to a car show, rallye or any event put on our calendar and hosted by a club member. We try to follow a 30-day guideline as far as notification to all club members. In other words, we like to have the event posted for 30 days to give everyone time to schedule. In some cases this is not possible and the Board will review these instances on a case-by-case basis and make a determination. At the end of the year, the points are totaled and the top ten point holders are given recognition awards at our annual banquet. There should be a sign-in sheet at every club event. The chairperson or host is responsible for providing a sign-in sheet and forwarding it to the Points Director at the conclusion of the event.

The following list is the guideline used to award our participation points.

- One point for attending a CCCC General Membership Meeting or Social Event.
- One point for attending the annual CCCC Awards Banquet.
- One point for attending the annual NCCC Michigan Region Banquet.
- One point for entering your Corvette in any non-sanctioned car show designated as a club event.
- One point for entering your Corvette in any parade designated as a club event.
- One point for entering your Corvette in any non-sanctioned all Corvette show.
- One point for visiting the Corvette Museum. Maximum of one point per year.
- One additional point for arriving at any of the above in a Corvette.
- One point for writing an article used in the CCCC newsletter. The article must be at least ½ page in length. Articles are published at the discretion of the CCCC Editor. Articles or reports required by an elected officer are not eligible. Maximum of 1 point per year.
- One point for each full day in attendance at the annual NCCC Convention. 5 points per year maximum.
- Two points for each CCCC elected office held or for serving as the Web Master of the club website.
- Two points for working at each CCCC sponsored or sanctioned competition, charity or fund-raising event.
- Two points for chairing or co-chairing a CCCC social, charity or fund-raising event. Plus the worker or attendance point for the chaired event.
- Four points for chairing or co-chairing a CCCC sponsored race, rallye, concours, or car show event. 4 points per competition season will be allowed plus the worker or attendance point for the chaired event. Chair or co-chair must be instrumental in organizing and running the event. "Signature Only" chairpersons will not be awarded points.





Making the most of Auto-X

Here is the third installment of a five part guide to Auto-X by Vic Nightscales. See the Jan/ Feb. '04 issue for Part II.

Part III: Walking the Auto-X Course.

Alking the Auto-X Course is key to becoming fast in auto-x.

That's because walking the course allows you to memorize the route and visualize the fastest line through the course.

You will be driving the course in approximately a minute, and if you must focus on deciding which way to turn after the next cone, you will be slower than if you already have that sorted out in your mind through your walking efforts.

John Ames, who has eight SCCA Solo II National Championships in four different classes, says, "My goal from walking is to memorize the course and create a plan for the car's path, so I can close my eyes and mentally drive it. During the course walk I am learning the sequence of turns ... I look ahead and visualize where I will drive the car and which cones are key for being close to." (As quoted in "Solo Speed" by Rocky Entriken, SportsCar Aug.03). [Note: Solo is another name for auto-x and John Ames currently drives a Corvette.1

Walk the course in the path where you think the driver's seat will be when in the car. Keep in mind that whenever the steering wheel is turned the car looses speed, and the further it is turned the more speed is lost. The trick is to pick the path that minimizes the number of times and the degrees you must turn the steering wheel to complete the course. (Read those last two sentences again, they

are the key to speed.)

Plan out the path in terms of the gear you will be in, the points of acceleration and the places for braking. In the case of speed vs. distance, choose the path of less distance.

The first time walking the course you are finding the general direction, so minor distractions and conversation are not of great concern. Be sure to cover any gossip about other club members at this point so that on your next walk through you can fully concentrate on the course.

During your next walks through you need to concentrate on the details of car placement and possible shifting or braking points. Sometimes it helps to walk through with another member and talk over your plan of running the course. This can help both of you.

Sometimes it helps to

break the course up into a handful of sections rather than trying to remember every gate, wall, or cone. Sometimes it helps to stop numerous times during the walk to conduct a mental review of the course to that point in order to brand that section into your memory.

If you have done your homework well, you should be able to sit down, away from the course, and draw a fairly detailed map of the course.

Finally, sit in your car, close your eyes, and mentally travel the course to confirm your memorization process. This is the Zen of Corvette auto-x. But try to avoid nodding off and snoring.

Now get out there and have some fun!






