GOVERNOR'S MEETING REPORT MICHIGAN REGION NCCC FEBRUARY 20, 2007

This was the first 2007 meeting of the new Regional Executive. There are a number of new members on the MI Region NCCC Board; that combined with numerous issues, resulted in the meeting lasting until 10 PM.

Regional Secretary's Report

Due to a full time occupation, the Regional Secretary requested that all proposed Agenda items be sent to her at minimum 2 1/2 weeks before the meeting in question. For CCCC, that means issues that may be raised at our April meeting can be put on the May Regional Agenda.

Regional Treasurer's Report

The Regional Treasurer gave a financial report of savings and checking accounts, as well as CD's currently held by the bank.

The Regional Treasurer handed out a copy of "NCCC Guide to Federal Tax Matters" due to a number of clubs; including CCCC asking for guidelines on club expenditures.

Points Director's Report

There are no new points as of yet this year.

Events should be sent to both Renee and the Region Webmaster. Renee needs to have them in his hands 70 days before the event and the webmaster needs them for posting on the region website.

NCCC Pins and Calendars

The hottest issue was NCCC Pins and calendars. All Governors were taking flak form their clubs on the one pin, one calendar received in the NCCC renewal package.

Barb Harris advised that all groups within NCCC had been asked to identify areas for budget cuts. The reduction in number of pins and calendars was one of the cuts. National claims the Governors were advised and voted on the measure, the Governor's in attendance that were carryovers from last year, vociferously denied that they had been asked, let alone had given consent. The issue has been put on the National meeting Agenda for the weekend.

Regional Banquet

This was the second hottest issue. Concern was raised that the event broke the Region by-laws as the approved location; by Governor vote, was Frankenmuth. The question raised was "how can the venue change and how could their not be an approved budget for the event?" Since no club representative was present to answer, the executive will investigate the issue.

Competition Report

To generate interest in cross club participation, there will be a new All Around Region competition award.

At the Awards Banquet, one venue for each type of competitive event will be selected at random. The intent is to award the Regional member with the highest participation and scores in these chosen events.

NCCC Rule Book

The rule book is currently being revised. There is a divide between those who want it in hard copy and those who want it in electronic format. In preparation for the upcoming National meeting, the Regional members were polled. The Region supports the publication of the electronic format, with the proviso that the hard copy be available for this edition in transition.

Logo Contest

The winning Logo in the contest by a count of 61 votes, was Logo #1 submitted by Jim Harris. This logo can be seen on the website.

2009 NCCC National Convention bid

The proposal is coming along. Tentative dates are August 7-14 at the Amway Grand Plaza Hotel in Grand Rapids. Hotel charges will be \$112/night with \$16/day ramp parking. Free parking is available two blocks away. There will be 2 days of speed events along with Concours, Rallyes and Drags. The region is trying to add a lot more social and sightseeing events than in the past, as the Region clearly recognizes a shift in interest in members. Gone are the days of the NCCC being a racing organization, members are now more interested in socialization and side events.

2006 National Convention

Final numbers show that National lost a considerable amount of money.

2007 National Convention

The 2007 National Convention will be held June 14-22, there is a flyer with more information available on the website. Registration opened February 1, the first cut-off date is March 15.

Because of issues with scheduling the race track, some schedule changes have been made since the registration package was printed. There will be events held at the National Museum and the assembly plant in Bowling Green.

A relative of the Jackson Governor runs a recording studio. If there is interest and flexibility then a "Michigan secret" visit to see a Country star during recording may be available. Anyone attending and interested should see Barb Harris at convention.

Coventry Blues

It appears the Coventry club; with more than 100 members, is in trouble. Membership apathy and lack of willingness to run events means the club may fold. Various Regional members offered to make contact and see if there was anything that could be done to help.

Corvette Raffle





Filling Your CCCC Calendar

From your Social Director, Competition Director & Governor

This year the Board is working hard to increase the number of opportunities members will have to drive their Corvettes with other club members. These opportunities will be a combination of social events, competition events, club events and other events, such as the Portland Cruise, Hooters Cruise-in, and Cruisin' The Gut. To get things kicked off, you will find the preliminary April Calendar in this newsletter.

The calendar will be published at least 30 days in advance, and featured club events will be highlighted with the club logo. In the event that 10 or more members show up for an event, it will counted as a qualifying event under the current CCCC Points Program. If less than 10 members show up, the event will be considered an informal non-qualifying event, but will proceed as scheduled.

Many of the events will be simple, just show up at the appointed time and place. Since this is a new endeavor for the club, there will invariably be a few potholes, detours, and route changes in the first month or so.

We will be trying out a number of new activities including "Fun Rallyes", "Country Curves", "Eat Out of Town", "Tech Tuesdays", "Drive and ?", "Coffee", "Mini-Shows" and more. Depending on turnout and interest; we will be continually adjusting and improving the offering.

FOR THE MONTH OF APRIL

Coffee

This will be an informal meeting of those interested in socializing. Meetings will alternate between morning and evening coffee sessions every Monday. The morning sessions will meet at Beaners in East Lansing, located at 1429 Saginaw (at Coolidge). The evening sessions will meet at Starbucks in Okemos, located at 3552 Meridian Crossing (Okemos Rd/Jolly). Depending on the level of interest, the evening coffee sessions might morph into ice cream sessions once the weather gets warmer.

Tech Tuesdays

We will kick off these informal "fix your car" nights at the home of Craig Iansiti. (check your membership roster for the address). During the season we will announce alternate locations which will generally be at the homes of members owning lifts. Tech Tuesdays are not intended to be a "school" of any kind. Rather they are designed to provide a venue and opportunity for a few guys/gals to get together and help each other complete some of those nagging items that one never seems to get done without encouragement and/or help from others. There can be many things (or nothing) going on at once and everyone is invited, even if they don't have anything in need of work.



Corvette History - March

• March 2, 1990: At the Firestone Test Center near Fort Stockton, Texas, a team of drivers set a dozen land speed records with a Corvette ZR-1 and a Corvette L-98. Cars were in near stock condition, minus mufflers and catalytic converters. Records include 5000 miles in a time of 28:46:12.462, 5000 km in a time of 17:40:53.748, and 4221.256 miles in 24 hours. Average speed for all record runs were 170-175 MPH. One driver is Corvette Development and Validation Manager John Heinricy.




- March 6, 1996: Corvette's Chief Engineer, Dave Hill makes the final decision to stop C4
 model Corvette production and put all emphasis on C5. June 16 is set as the last day of
 building C4 Corvettes.
- March 7, 1997: Chevrolet begins selling the 1997 model Corvette.
- March 14, 1977: The 500,000th Corvette drives off the assembly line.
- March 18, 2000: In Florida, the 48th Annual Superflo 12 Hours at Sebring is held.
 Corvette C5-R, #4, driven by Ron Fellows, Chris Kneifel, and Justin Bell, places 16th overall. Corvette C5-R, #3, driven by Andy Pilgrim, Kelly Collins, and Frank Freon places 24th overall.
- March 20, 1999: At the 12 Hours of Sebring race, Ron Fellows, John Paul Jr., and Chris Kneifel drive C5-R No. 3, finishing 4th in class. Andy Pilgrim, Scott Sharp, and John Heinricy drive C5-R No. 4, but do not finish the race.
- March 23, 1957: Chevrolet enters four Corvettes in the 12 Hours of Sebring race in Florida. The Corvette SS (Super Sport), driven by John Fitch and Juan Fangio, runs only 120 miles before being retired on lap 23 due to erratic brakes and faulty rear suspension. Richard Thompson and Gaston Andrey in No. 4 finish first in GT Production class, 12th overall. A third Corvette wins Modified Production class, 15th overall. The fourth Corvette takes 16th overall. 12th place is the best showing for a car in GT class at Sebring.
- March 23, 1992: General Motors applies for a registered trademark of "STINGRAY".
- March 24, 1956: Four 1956 Corvettes take part in the Florida International 12-Hour Grand Prix of Endurance, at Sebring, Florida. Car No. 1, with 307-ci engine, driven by John Fitch and Walt Hansgen, runs in SCCA class C/Modified, and finishes the race, winning first in its class, and ninth overall. Car No. 5, with 265-ci engine, high performance Duntov cam and 4.11-to-1 final drive, and driven by Dale Duncan and John Eager, runs in class B/Production, but breaks an axle shaft 20 minutes into the race. Car No. 6, with 265-ci engine, 3.70-to-1 final drive, driven by Ray Crawford and Max Goldman, runs in SCCA class B/Production, and finishes the race 6th in class and 15th overall. Car No. 7, with 265-ci engine, 4.11-to-1 final drive, driven by Ernie Erickson and Chuck Hassan, runs in class B/Production, but blows a piston about 1:20 hours into the race.
- March 27, 1962: At the 12 Hours of Endurance race at Sebring, Florida, M.J.R. Wylie and Duncan Black drive Gulf Oil's 1962 Corvette to 2nd in A/Production class, and 18th overall.

- March 27, 1978: The Wall Street Journal runs a front-page article about the 1978
 Corvette Indianapolis 500 Pace Cars, indicating they would be excellent investments.
- March, 1960: A Corvette finishes first in class at the 12 Hours of Sebring race. Two
 Corvettes of the Camoradi racing team, driven by Jim Jeffords and Fred Gamble, finish
 second and third in GT class.
- March, 1961: At the 12 Hours of Sebring race, Corvette drivers Delmo Johnson and Dave Morgan finish 1st in GT class and 11th overall.
- March, 1964: A Corvette finishes first in GT category at the 12 Hours of Sebring race.
- March, 1966: Roger Penske, in his 1966 Corvette with 427 ci engine, finishes first in GT class at the 12 Hours of Sebring race.
- March, 1967: At the 12 Hours of Sebring race, Dave Morgan and Don Yenko compete in a 1967 L88 Corvette, finishing 1st in GT class and 10th overall.
- March, 1968: At the 12 Hours of Sebring race in Florida, Yenko/Rodriguez race 1968 L88
 Corvette (No. 2), Thompson/DeLorenzo race 1968 L88 Corvette (No. 4), and Morgan/Sharp
 race 1968 L88 Corvette (No. 3). One finishes first in GT class.
- March, 1972: At the 12 Hours of Sebring race in Florida, Dave Heinz and Bob Johnson race Toye English's 1969 L88 convertible to first in GT class.
- March, 1973: The driving team of John Greenwood, Ron Grable, and Mike Brockman drive
 a Corvette to a win in its class at Sebring, and taking third place overall, the best ever
 showing for a Corvette at Sebring
- . March, 1983: The 1984 Corvette goes on sale in the US, except for California.
- March, 1989: Chevrolet introduces the Corvette ZR-1 at the Geneva Auto Show in Switzerland.
- March, 1990: Dennis Amodeo, winner of 36 Corvettes through a 1989 VH-1 contest, sells the collection to artist Peter Max for approximately US\$1.5 million.
- March, 1992: Ground-breaking ceremony is held next to the Corvette plant for a permanent home for the National Corvette Museum.







