Two corrections were made to the February 20 meeting minutes regarding the April 1 non-sanction event should have been CCM and not MAG. In addition, GLCC was added to the list of club attendees. Sharon Meeseman made a motion to accept the minutes as amended and Bernie Christian Seconded.

Treasurer - Elana Siebel

Elana gave the financial report. The report was approved as written. Elana reported that there were additional sanctions but nearly all clubs had paid.

Points - Sue Sweet

Sue reported that there are no updates. With just a few events, so far it is too early in the season for a report. Sue asked that everyone check their National # for tracking points and when submitting points.

Webmaster -Jim Sweet

Jim added Corvette Club of Battle Creek to the web site for the Michigan Region. We received an e-mail from Mid America Motor requesting a link to advertise for them. There was discussion that followed related to charging them, if we should have a reciprocating link etc. This might help defray the cost of our Web site. Bill Siebel will do some investigating at the Governors Meeting.

Bill Siebel mentioned that the RE's are working on cleaning up the rulebook. He also gave an update on the Coventry Corvette Club and how they are doing. It was suggested that they need to send someone from their club as a representative at our Regional Meetings.

Membership- Barb Harris

Barb passed out membership applications to those who needed them. NCCC brochures were also provided. Barb explained some new rules for Governors: For new members, send a revised form with application with the new logo. Please e-mail her when you will be sending new member forms. New logo is on shirts. Jim Harris modeled one for us and the cost for the long sleeve is \$21.20 each. They are also looking into golf shirts with our new logo. Anyone wanting a shirt please e-mail your order to Barb. It was decided they would be Polo Gray.

Competition - Rene' Cardenas

Rene' went over the list of Sanction events coming up before Convention. All flyers, and sanctions need to be sent to Rene' in time and detailed including Governors name, location, chair person, times, prices etc. He asked that we use the Web site form to submit points. Rene' also announced which events were drawn at the Regional Banquet that will be under the new regional point system that is supplementing the NCCC points. This is to encourage more participation by members in the clubs around the region.

OLD BUSINESS

Bill Siebel read the proposed Bi-Law Changes regarding Term Limits of Officers. A vote was taken and there were 10 yes, 2 oppose, 0 abstentions. Joe Scafero suggested that we have a starting point on this and that it be immediate for 2008 elections.

Regional Banquet Report: Camille Werhun gave the report and supplied a very organized income/expense statement. Net income from the banquet was \$45.47. Bill Siebel thanked Camille for a job well done and for a great banquet.

Driving School-Post Report – Mark Hanlin thanked, Chris Scafero, Ray and Sharon Meeseman, Rene' Cardena's and Kurt Schwamberger for being the instructors, Dwight and crew for doing the timing and for the clubs who sent individuals to help out. Thanks to the three host clubs Kalamazoo, Lansing, and Battle Creek for all their hard work. The school generated a net profit for 2007 of \$149.16 with a total of \$534.16 on hand to hold the 2008 school

Convention 2009 – Jeff Janus reported that the proposal was submitted to Committee. A revised proposal will go to Committee in St. Louis. It will be held at the Amway Grand and the money issues are being resolved. Food and Beverages are still being discussed. Dual Venues at Gratten and Gingerman Raceways and Drags on US131. Other activities are being discussed.

Jim Harris passed out a planner/schedule to keep us on track. Passed out a tri-fold brochure that Danny created. Magazines, etc. will be supplied on the State of Michigan and passed out at convention in Nashville to promote the 09 convention. Danny made up 150 DVD's for the Steering Committee in September approx. cost of \$300.00. 500 Flashing buttons would cost \$210.00. 1000 copies of the tri-fold brochures will be put in the registration packets at National Convention in Nashville, the cost for these is \$278.00.

May do a power-point presentation but the fees are \$450.00 so we are negotiating this fee and or possibly use our own equipment. Jim asked if we wanted to spend the amounts listed above. Originally, \$1000.00 was put into the budget. Motion by Rick Werhun to accept above fees not to exceed \$1500.00. Seconded by Sharon Meeseman.

Bill Siebel called for a vote: Yes votes = 13 No votes=0 Abstentions = 0

Danny Kellermyer reported about Pratt Miller and how excited they are about the possibility of the Convention coming to Michigan. They sent books and posters to our Governors. He shared that if every Club in the Region would take a "piece of the pie" and help with the work involved to put this event on it will be very helpful.

Jim Sweet- We can set up e-mail addresses for specific reasons on our web site. He is going to put the entire convention guide booklet on Michcorvette.org web site.

Discussion took place related to the process for getting job assignments for working on the convention and what the pre-requisites for doing those jobs.

Jeff, Jim and Danny all highly recommended that the more people we could get to the September 7 and 8 Governors meeting the better. Encourage your club members to attend.




"Yes," said Joe, "It is more fun to get the girls to look than to throw dirt."

Corvette History - June


- June 1, 1981: Production of Corvettes begins at a new plant in Bowling Green, Kentucky. The first Corvette is a beige 1981 model.
- June2, 1990: Ground-breaking begins on the National Corvette Museum, in Bowling Green, Kentucky.
- June 4, 1957: The Automobile Manufacturer's Association passes a resolution recommending that member companies (including General Motors) not participate in auto racing.





- June 14, 1993: Corvette program manager Russ McLean and chief engineer Dave Hill meet with the General Motors Strategy Board, including General Motors president Jack Smith, to get approval for Concept Initiation of the 1997 Corvette program. The plan is approved.
- June 17, 2000: The 24 Hours of Le Mans race is run, in Paris, France. For the first time, Chevrolet's Corvette Group officially enters two Corvette C5-R race cars. They place 3rd and 4th in GTS class, 10th and 11th overall.
- June 21, 1996: The last Corvette of the fourth-generation "C4" body style (used since 1984) is produced. Over 300,000 cars were produced since 1984. The car is bought by Mike Yager, owner of Mid-America Design, for his museum in Illinois.
- June 26, 1994: The first C5 (1997 model) alpha test car rolls out of the assembly room. Build chief John Fehlberg has the honor of being the first C5 driver.
- June 29, 1993: Chevrolet general manager Jim Perkins states that a fifth-generation Corvette will be produced for the 1997 model year.
- June 29, 1999: The last 1999 model Corvette is built, a silver coupe.
- June 30, 1953: The first production Corvette rolls off the assembly line at Chevrolet Plant, Number 35, near Flint, Michigan. Sticker price: just over US\$3,000.
 Assembly line worker Tony Kleiber has the honor of driving the first Corvette off the assembly line.
- June, 1953: Chevrolet begins production of the Corvette on a tiny assembly line in Flint, Michigan.
- June, 1960: In Le Mans, France, the 24 Hours of Le Mans race is held. Briggs Cunningham enters three white Corvettes with 283 ci engines, driven by John Fitch and Bob Grossman, Cunningham and Bill Kimberley, and Fred Windridge and Richard Thompson. The Fitch/Grossman car reaches 151 mph, and finishes 8th overall, 5th in GT class. Racing team Camoradi U.S.A. enters two factory prepared Corvettes. One places 10th overall, 7th in GT class.
- June, 1961: The Corvette Shark showcar makes its first appearance, at Road America in Elkhart Lake, Wisconsin.
- June, 1967: In Paris, France, the 24 Hours of Le Mans race is held. California car dealer Dana Chevrolet enters a 1967 Corvette coupe with 427 ci L-88 engine, driven by Dick Guldstrand and Bob Bondurant. The lone Corvette is the heaviest car in the race. Dick Guldstrand sets a new record speed of 171.5 mph on the Mulsanne straight, 22 mph faster than the GT class winning Ferrari. In the 13th hour, the engine fails, ending the race for the Corvette.
- June, 1971: A full-size fiberglass model of a Wankel-engined Corvette prototype is completed, and shown to top management of General Motors. General Motors President Ed Cole approves construction of a complete running car.
- June, 1978: The movie "Corvette Summer" premieres, in Maumee, a suburb of Toledo, Ohio. Terry Michaelis, of T. Michaelis Corvette Supplies, Inc. arranged to have the world premiere there, and raffles off a 1978 Corvette Indy pace car replica. Plus, every Corvette in the country was invited to the party. The Corvette parade set a new mark in the Guiness Book of Records, at somewhere between 5000 and 7000 Corvettes.
- June, 1978: The first Bloomington Gold Corvette show is held. It was formerly called Corvette Corral.
- June, 1985: Group Lotus in Norfolk, England, proposes building a new engine for Chevrolet, who quickly approves the project. The engine would become the LT5 for the ZR1 Corvette.
- June, 1985: Chevrolet Chief Engineer Don Runkle and Lotus' Tony Rudd discuss creating a new show car to show off their engineering expertise. The project
 would become the CERV III.
- June, 1994: General Motors' Strategy Board meets again with the Corvette group, continuing their arguments defending their request to proceed on schedule toward production building of the new 1997 model Corvette. It is agreed that plant conversion would begin in April 1996, with final current model production ending on June 21, 1996.
- June, 1995: Three Reeves Callaway SuperNatural Corvettes enter the Le Mans race in Paris, France. One qualifies for the pole position in the GT2 class, and finishes second in class, 10th overall. Another finishes third in class, and 11th overall.
- June, 1999: At the Grand Prix of Sonoma at the Sears Point Raceway in California, Chris Kneifel and Ron Fellows drive a C5-R to second in class.
