### Governor's Report-September 4th Michigan Regional Meeting

### **Health Issues Within The Region**

There were reports that several region members are suffering from recently diagnosed medical issues.

Elaina Siebel has been diagnosed with cancer. Her chemotherapy sessions begin this week.

Bill Siebel has elevated PAS levels, his Doctors fear he has cancer and he awaits test results

Carol Johnson has kidney cancer that has migrated to the lymphatic system. They are removing a kidney and starting both radiation and chemotherapy treatments

Barb Bush has been diagnosed with pancreatic cancer .She has not yet decided whether to seek treatment.

On a positive note Kim Fast has completed her chemotherapy and the first set of tests show no signs of cancer. The Doctor's are awaiting the next set of test results before declaring her in remission.

### **Treasurer's Report**

In Elaina's absence Bill circulated the cash flow statement and bank balance.

The Region has a total of \$12,518.71 in its accounts

### **Competition Report**

Jackson and Capital City low speed results have not yet been received.

Technically they have been sent but allegedly not in an NCCC approved format.

Rene asked the clubs to resubmit. [Craig has checked column by column and the data as submitted was in format identical to that identified on the Region website. Rich has resent the file to Rene along with Craig reconciliation and asked that he again identify what is allegedly incorrect]

In anticipation of winning the National convention in 2009, The Region is running simultaneous high speed and low speed events at both Gingerman and Gratton on October 13<sup>th</sup> and 14<sup>th</sup>. The format used will be identical to that that will be used at Convention. Anyone interested in volunteering to work at the speed events at Convention is asked to come out both is year and next year to work and learn the actual jobs they will have at Convention.

### **Corvettes at MIS**

The IRL has decided not to return to MIS. MIS rejected the only date offered to them because the time interval between that race and the June NASCAR race did not permit enough time to get the track in condition. MIS hopes in the future to bring ALMS or road coarse style racing to the track but as this moment there is no venue for the Corvettes at MIS.

Additionally participants in the parade lap disregarded track safety rules, engaged in drag racing, passing and driving 3 abreast through the turns. As a result, Corvettes have been banned form future parade lap activities.

### **Regional Banquet**

The Flint club has offered to host the annual Regional banquet. They are proposing a venue in Frankenmuth. Frankenmuth as a destination was endorsed by the Club Governor's. A date in March will soon be picked.

The likely venue will be Black Forest Restaurant. The meal will likely run in the \$20-25 range. A mandatory beverage selection of \$10.50 is required. With Tax and gratuity the total is expected to be approx \$35/person.

### **Competition Awards**

As a means of reducing National costs, a proposal has been received to increase the minimum competition points level from 200 to 300 points. This means that badges and awards will only be presented to those who now exceeded 300 points.

The Governors present rejected the proposal citing that many clubs' top participant only has 200 points; meaning that many clubs would receive no awards. Non competing members in winning clubs would ALL receive awards. The recommended proposal that the Region will take to National is to leave the 200 point threshold standing, but only provide awards to club participants that had participated in at least 5 events.

As it currently stands, a winning 400 member club with 10 competing members is entitled to championship badges for all 400 members. The counter proposal was seen as a better way to reduce costs while maintaining awards for competitors.

### MICHIGAN REGIONAL MEETING MINUTES TUESDAY, SEPTEMBER 4, 2007

Regional Executive, Bill Siebel called the meeting to order at 7:30 PM at La Senorita's Lansing, Michigan. Bill asked for a moment of silence to honor the passing of Sue McGee.

### **Secretary** - Angela Hanlin

Angela read a thank you note received from the family of Will Adams who recently passed away. Three corrections were made to the May minutes. Bernie Christian made a motion to accept the minutes as amended, Richard Shatkosky seconded. Motion carried.

### Treasurer -

Bill passed around the treasurer's report in Elana's absence. She has a serious illness and was unable to attend. There were no additions or corrections to her report.

### **Points** – Sue Sweet

Sue passed out the current point standings report. There are a few events outstanding and not included in this report. Royals Car Show, Grand Valley Rally, Jackson and Capital City Low Speed Events and also Hamtramck Event. Forms must be sent to Rene' on the correct sheet and format. Lansing will need to re-do their low speed event.

### **Webmaster** – Jim Sweet

Jim asked that any new ideas for the web site be sent to him. Flyers need to be provided for club events. If he doesn't see the flyers they won't be on the web site.

### **Membership** – Barb Harris

Barb presented the NCCC award to Capital City Club for taking  $2^{nd}$  place at Convention for their club's web site. This is the second year in a row. Congratulations to Lansing!

Barb announced that we have a new club in the Michigan Region, The Calhoun County Corvettes with 28 members.

Anyone who would like to purchase Michigan Region Shirts please let Barb know. She will have this put on our web site so clubs can order them. Roger from Lakeshore said that they would like shirts but didn't know about them being available.

NCCC is setting up the Sue McGee Memorial Fund. She was Membership Director for over 15 years in her region.

Renewals will be due in November. Barb has brochures and membership applications available for anyone who needs them.

Carlisle show was a problem due to severe weather. 75 mile an hour winds with some people hospitalized.

Mackinaw Show brought in \$2000.00 worth of tickets for the new car, which will be a black coupe. Grand Valley sold over 230 tickets for their cars drawing.

### **Competition** – Rene' Cardenas

Rene' reported that a small meeting was held to discuss the events to be held for 2009 convention. The Low/High Speed events being held in October at Grattan and Gingermman will be the practice format for the 2009 convention. There was some discussion related to roll bars. Rene' told us that they are required on convertibles for high-speed events. Specific size/shape and must be 2 inches above the helmet.

### **2009 Convention** – Jeff Janus

Jeff reports that the proposal can be seen on our web site. There are still open chairpersons' positions. The presentation was made in July to the Executive Board. Final presentation is being made this weekend at the Governor's Meeting. Ballots will be passed out this weekend and the vote taken. Results will be announced in November.

Concourse will be set up at Meijer Gardens. Pratt Miller Tour being set up but limited spots will be available. Rene' suggested that the form with the jobs openings for convention be posted on the web site so people can know what to sign up for. Danny thanked everyone who had stepped forward and volunteered to take various positions and handed out nice ink pens as his thank you. Sue Sweet reported that Kim Fast is out of quarantine and is at home. She had one bone marrow test and it came back clear. She is still getting treatments.

Ray Meesseman reported that Dave Johnson's wife Carol has Kidney Cancer. The doctor's will be removing 1 kidney and she will be going thru treatments.

It was also reported that Barb Bush from CCM is in stage one of Pancreatic Cancer.

Ray Meesseman made a motion to close the nominations for 2008 officers, Jim Sweet Seconded.

### Region Banquet -

Bill Siebel asked if anyone was interested in hosting the Spring Banquet. Flint Corvette Club is looking at a couple of places. The Gateway Center in Flint and also the Black Forest in Frankenmuth. The Gateway wanted \$600 to reserve a room and would cost each individual approx. \$35.00. Black Forest would be a buffet and it would cost around \$20.00 per person plus \$10.50 for drinks. Jim Harris volunteered to Chair this event, Mark Hanlin said he would assist Jim if he needed help. There was a show of hands and it was unanimous to go to Frankenmuth. More details will follow at our November meeting.

### Midwest Region Point System Proposal for NCCC - Ray Meesseman

Ray reported that there is supposedly a \$19.00 rebate from NCCC for any club over 200 points at the end of the year. No one was aware of this rebate. Ray will find out at the Governor's meeting this weekend. Midwest Region is proposing that the total number of points be raised from 200 per individual to 300. This would help National save money. Jim Sweet asked about the \$10,000 spent last year, what did that include? There was much discussion on this subject. The general consensus of our Region was that we do not want the points to be increased to 300. Ray will take this to the Governor's meeting and see what happens and report back at the November meeting.

### NCCC Governor's Meeting September 6-7 2007

### **Committee Meeting Highlights**

### **COMPETITION**

### **Clarifications**

These clarifications are in place only until the current competition book is valid. It is intended that the new competition manual will be approved by the Governors before the year end.

- Cat back exhaust (Corsa & Others) Can the C5 H pipe be replaced with an X pipe in Classes 1H and 1HS? NO.
- Do the H pipe and O2 sensors in the C6 and newer need to be in the exhaust stock location? Yes
- C4 Hubcaps (Center caps) Do they need to be removed for speed events? YES
- C6 Z06 Spoilers- Is the Ron Fellows spoiler allowed in Group 1 in all C6 Z06's. YES

### **CONVENTIONS**

The final hotel bill was \$73,641. Final numbers have not been tabulated as some minor expenses are not yet in. The number currently stands at approximately \$39K profit which, as per NCCC guidelines, once finalized, is to be split between the hosting club and National. Note: This number includes the \$36K NCCC sponsorship of the convention of \$36K. Without this sponsorship the convention profit would have been \$3K.

The committee dealt with 9 requests for refunds .They included, medical, mechanical, family death, subpoena, and staying home to accept the delivery of a new Corvette. Some of the requests were approved some denied. All of the decisions were reasonable.

### **MEMBERSHIP**

### Distributions

The committee was focused on ways to reduce the cost of perk distributions. A new calendar source was found=savings \$5K.The calendars and 2 pins will be distributed via RMD's and Governors at the November meeting. This distribution will save \$3K versus a mailing.

### Blue Bars upgrade

Discussion ensued about ways to upgrade the look and content of BlueBars to have it compete for advertising with magazines such as Corvette Fever etc. It now costs \$9K to print and it is felt many members do not value it nor read it. It was noted that less than 10% of members are involved in competition events. The newsletter content should reflect the interests of the members at large. The question is what do we want in it?

### Redistricting

The committee is looking at ways to combine regions as a means of reducing the number of people attending meetings and the subsidization of those people attending. Currently Regional reps get their hotel and meals covered in full and get the IRS mileage rate of 44.8 cents per mile covered one way. The region or the members club usually covers the balance although this varies by region and club.

Another discussion involved how do we sell the benefits of the NCCC? East region lost 3 clubs last year at renewal time. The concern is that there will be additional loss this year as more and more clubs are social only and do not see the value in NCCC insurance for social events. It was noted that less than 10% of all NCCC insurance claims have been for speed events. The majority are for car shows and social events. What would be of value to members? More member discounts?

### **Governor's Meeting Sept 8**

### **FINANCIAL**

June minutes approved. Tax return filed and accepted. Audit completed. Bill to date \$4K Draft report done. Focus on Bank, convention, scholarship. Income statement, vs. presented financial reports & QuickBooks, dues vs. membership report.

Budgeting a loss of \$48K (lead to committee discussions of dues increase)

### **FCOA**

Florida region is up 74%. Windy City is #1 with 220, Cedar Rapids is #2 with 146, and CCCC is #3 with 73. # 3600 was assigned to Corvette Cleveland

### **BUSINESS MANAGER**

Term up at end of year, 1 meeting left. No claims since last meeting. K&K will continue as the Agent. The new carrier for '08 will be Scottsdale Insurance.

### **PUBLIC RELATIONS**

The display booth was at Carlisle. The next use is at FUNFEST. DOES CCCC WANT THE DISPLAY FOR ONE OF OUR EVENTS TO HELP CELEBRATE OUR 50th?

### WEBMASTER

There will be a link to the 2009 Convention proposals. There will be a link to received Governor's ballots. The web site will host pictures and bios of the candidates for officers.

Joan wants volunteers for judges for the 2008 Web contest. The volunteers should not be Governors or Regional Executives. The website committee will start a best practice forum with in a Q&A format along with FAQ's. It will be on the website.

Scholarship applications for 2008 are due May 8<sup>th</sup> 2008. Applications can be found on the website. There is a year to date \$60K cash balance in the Charity account, and the Balance sheet shows \$41K equity.

### **CONVENTION**

### 2007 Convention

Was successful, everyone had a super time. The committee processed refund requests. Financial reports are in limbo pending settlement of final expenses. Travel and refunds have not yet been factored in.

The final results will be presented at the November meeting

### 2008 Convention

Will be in Tulsa. There will be racing, high speed and low speed events being held at locations up to 50 miles away. There will also be Drag Racing events, Concourse, FunKana and Scenic driving trips along Route 66. There will also be Golf & Rallye events held.

There will be several entertainment events including shopping, museum and Aquarium tours, theme parties, magicians and Youth programs. The awards banquet will be held on Friday, and lots of free food and adult beverages will be available. A Tentative schedule of events will be placed on the National website on the Conventions page.

### **SPONSORSHIP**

Staff was at Carlisle and is attending Funfest. All dollars are in from this years sponsors. Next years program is in the final stages of development. We have offered special pages for "Members Discounts", providers Neon Clocks and CorvetteGearUSA.com are the two latest to take up this offer.

### **BLUEBARS**

The Convention issue is at the printer; it is 84 pages long and will be out by the end of September. Deadline for the fall issue is September 16.

### **DISTRIBUTIONS**

2008 membership cards ordered, 2008 Calendars in, 2008 Pins expected by end of month. There will be two pins per master/spouse member again in '08.To save money (\$3K) pins and calendars will be distributed to the regional Membership Directors and Governors in attendance. The RMD's will ensure the Governors receive the perks. The Governors are responsible for distributing to the renewing members.

At the November meeting there will be 1600 left over 2007 pins available for distribution to members who really want one. PLEASE HAVE THE CLUBS IDENTIFY THEIR NEEDS AND COMMUNICATE IT TO THEIR RMD. It is noted that there is insufficient supply to give one to every member that only received one. Therefore it is requested that the numbers only reflect those that REALLY want a pin.

### **MEMBERSHIP**

Up 418 over '06. Governors please ensure that renewals get back to the RMD early. There was a question as to the actual cost for a new member versus a renewal. The membership VP did not have actual costs with him but will have them for the next meeting. The costs include New members-license frame, rule book, patch, decal, membership card, 2 pins & calendar. Renewals-2 pins and calendar.

### **PRESIDENT**

NCM Board Meeting Labor Day cruise-in 650 Vettes.

Board borrowing \$7.5 M for expansion

Spending \$870K for 55 acres of land for 1.2 mile road course, Auto-x pad and a drag strip.

They expect to rent these new facilities for training, driver's school and events.

To raise funds at the Corvette homecoming they want to sell miniature Corvettes for club and companies to buy, paint, display. The cost to obtain one is \$3K. (Which is a donation to the NCM) and the NCM then get proceeds form the auction of the painted Corvettes.

### **OLD BUSINESS**

Nomination of Officers

4 positions are up for voting. VP Competition, Secretary, Sergeant at Arms are all running unopposed. There are 3 candidates for Business Manager. Biographies and Pictures will be posted on the NCCC website

### **NEW BUSINESS**

Convention presentations

The Business Manager inspected both venues and declared they were both more than adequate to host the 2009 Convention. Both Michigan and Colorado springs made presentations. Michigan's was a very polished audio visual combination that included a representative of the Grand Rapids visitors' bureau.

Colorado's was a casual walk through or a print out. Several times during the presentation the Colorado Springs presenter said their facility is not as good as Michigan's in relation to the Hotel, the Tracks for speed events and social program.

### **BY-LAW CLEAN-UP**

The way NCCC handles changes to the by-laws is an annual verbal presentation of the proposed changes to the Governors in September. This is followed by the written changes in the annual Officer/Convention ballot package. A simple majority of Governors is sufficient for passing the changes. This year there are 3 proposed changes:

- <u>Page 8 NOTICES of Meetings</u>. The NCCC wants to move to the 21<sup>st</sup> Century. Mailing written notices of meetings and special meetings is no longer expedient. The NCCC wants to use electronic communications for official notices as per the by-laws. The words *written* and *mail* shall be changed to *sent*. This simple change will permit the use of electronic communications to expedite notice and reduce the cost of providing notice.
- <u>Page 14 Convention Reserve Fund</u>. The Convention Reserve Fund was earlier eliminated by vote of governors. However; the by-laws say that any surplus of Convention proceeds (Profit) is split between the host organization and the Corporation (NCCC). And "the Corporate share shall be place in the Convention Reserve fund" As there is no reserve fund, this will be changed to put the *Corporate share in the General Funds*
- <u>Article 11 Section 3 Line 5.</u> The current by-laws require that proposed changes are to be presented at the first meeting after the Annual meeting. The proposal is to establish a timeline so the Regional Executives have some time to digest the proposal prior to presentation.

Actual wording will be included with the ballots which will be sent to Governors by the end of the month.

### **RULEBOOK**

The Competition VP presented the binder with the proposed new rule book. Ideally this should have been copied and distributed to the Governors for review. The Parliamentarian argued that the by-laws are vague and thought it reasonable to expect them to be gone though or provided in hard copy. The meeting room was required for another function in 15 minutes and it was not practical to review them.

A motion was made to accept them as presented. Debate focused on not approving something unseen. It was agreed that the by-laws required them to be presented at this meeting, in order for them to be voted on and in effect for January 1, 2008. On a point of order, a vote was taken on acceptance of the presented new Rulebook. The motion was defeated.

A motion was then made for the VP Competition to send (electronically) a copy of the proposed new Rule Book to all Governors for review with a vote on acceptance to be held at the November Governor's meeting. The motion was voted on and passed.

The parliamentarian then stated that the by-laws requirements to present and vote on had been met and pending review and approval would permit the new rulebook to be in place for January 1.

### **BUDGET 2008**

It is a realistic forecast but budgets a loss. There was discussion about what could be done and was it realistic, but time was running out on room availability.

### **Corvette History - October**

 October 15, 1954: Zora Arkus Duntov writes a memo to Ed Cole and Maurice Olley, noting that the Corvette appeared to be a failure. He suggests that to drop the Corvette would be an admission of failure. He urges General Motors not to cancel the car, but to create a separate department within Chevrolet to oversee Corvette Development.



- October 7, 1960: The CBS TV show, "Route 66" debuts with two young men driving a 1960 Corvette around the US in search of adventure.
- October 13, 1962: 1963 model production Corvettes make their racing debut at the Los Angeles Times Three-Hour Invitational Grand Prix in Riverside, California. The Ford-powered Shelby Cobra also makes its debut. Four Z06-equipped Corvettes enter, but only one finished, driven by Doug Hooper. The lone Cobra breaks its rear axle one hour into the race. Hooper's Corvette wins the race.
- October 5, 1965: The second Mako shark II car debuts at the Paris Auto Show in France. This version is fully drivable, with a 427ci engine.
- October 4, 1973: General Motors premiers the 390ci mid-engined Corvette Four-Rotor prototype at the Paris Automobile Salon in France. The Corvette Two Rotor is also shown. Both use rotary engines based on Wankel technology.
- October 26, 1988; The Callaway Sledgehammer Corvette reaches a top speed of 254.76 mph at the Transportation Research Center in Ohio.
- October 18, 1989: The final 1989 SCCA Corvette Challenge race is run, in St. Petersburg, Florida at the St. Petersburg Grand Prix circuit. The Texas American Racing Team, with driver Scott Lagase, wins the race.&nbs; Overall, Bill Cooper of the Valley Chevrolet team wins the series.
- October 1992: General Motors executives approve the design of the next-generation Corvette, with a target release year of 1997.
- October 19, 1995: GM names Dave Hill, Corvette's vehicle line executive, a new title in General Motors' ongoing restructuring.
- October 1, 1996: The first production 1997 model Corvette is completed.
- October 19, 1992: Corvette program manager, Russ McLean informs his staff that the GM Strategy Board has placed all projects after 1996 on hold or canceled, including the 1997 Corvette and later projects.
- October 1992: The last (number 10) Callaway Twin Turbo Speedster Corvette is completed.
