





Corvette History - 1982, Last of the C3's

The 1982 Corvette was the first since 1955 to come without an available manual gearbox. Its only available transmission was a newly standard four-speed automatic, which was basically the previous three-speed Turbo-Hydra-Matic with a long-striding overdrive fourth gear tacked on. As before, there was a torque converter lockup effective on all forward gears except first, governed by the engine's electronic control unit.

Other mechanical changes for 1982 included the addition of an in-tank electric fuel pump



and a new solenoid-operated trap door in the hood that opened at full throttle for better breathing. The air filter, which had previously contained charcoal, reverted to plain paper. The exhaust system was extensively redesigned around a significantly smaller and lighter catalytic converter.

Cosmetic alterations were limited to small "Cross-Fire Injection" labels above the front-fender vents and a two-tone paint option that recalled the 1978 Silver Anniversary treatment: silver over a deep burgundy, separated by a red pinstripe.

For the generation's last hurrah, Chevrolet issued another commemorative "Collector's Edition" model. However, recalling its experience with bogus 1978 Pace Car Replicas, the division handled the 1982 series differently, building the special model only "as needed" to satisfy customer orders (though about the same number -- 6,759 -- would be built). Unique vehicle identification number plates were affixed to further deter someone from

turning a standard car into the Collector's Edition.

In many ways, the 1982 Corvette was the best C3 of all. Setting it apart were cloisonné emblems on the hood, rear deck, and steering wheel; silver-beige metallic paint with graduated shadow-like contrast striping on the hood and bodysides; bronze-tint glass T-tops; and finned "turbine" alloy wheels like the ones first seen on the 1963 Sting Ray. Inside were matching silver-beige leather upholstery and door trim, leather-wrapped steering wheel, and luxury carpeting. A less obvious difference was this version's frameless lift-up glass hatch, which had been omitted from the 1978 restyle because of cost considerations. Incidentally, it was not available on the base 1982 Corvette, though several aftermarket suppliers had turned to offering this as a conversion for "glassback" models.

What's more, the Collector Edition carried the dubious distinction of being the first Corvette to break the \$20,000 price barrier, list-



ing at \$22,538 -- which was a far cry from the \$4,663 it had taken to buy a nicely equipped 1968 model.

With 10 extra horsepower and again blessed with fuel injection, the latest small-block Corvette showed definite performance gains despite being hobbled by the economy-minded automatic transmission. Road & Track timed it hitting the quarter-mile in 16.1 seconds at 84.5 mph and accelerating from 0 to 60 mph in 7.9 seconds.



Yet perhaps because a new model was known to be near, and aggravated by an ailing national economy, production fell to 25,407 units for '82, the lowest Corvette total since 1967.

But through its long and controversial run, the C3 would mark its place in automotive history as a true survivor. The passing years -- despite the array of adversity that came with them -- had been kind to the Shark, and the car never lost sight of its essential mission and character.

With 56 years of tradition behind it, no other American icon represents “power”, “prestige”, and “performance” like Corvette. For many, it remains the epitome of automotive aspiration, drawing stares of mixed envy and admiration. And now Malibu Boats has created a new Corvette to desire. This one runs on water.

The new Corvette Limited Edition Sport-V bares more than a resemblance to its legendary landlocked brother. It exhibits strikingly precise styling cues. From the signature Corvette “Cove” tooled into the hull to the authentic Corvette emblems to the power wing windshield to the rear taillight design used for through-hull ventilation to the authentic Corvette rims on the custom Corvette trailer. This boat speaks to the storied traditions of Corvette with a tone of its own.

The Corvette boat from Malibu blurs the line between tradition and progression. No longer just a place on the lake where you hang out in your boat, the Corvette “Cove” is the at-a-

Malibu engineers paid homage to the thrill of the open road by incorporating windows that roll down into the power wing windshield. The Corvette-styled closed bow becomes impressively functional as the bow hood opens to reveal LED lighting, a dual subwoofer high powered stereo system and specific storage centers.

This is not the first time General Motors has enlisted the award winning manufacturer Malibu Boats to build the legendary Corvette Boat. When GM selected Malibu Boats in 1996 to design and produce the then (C4) Corvette Limited Edition Ski Boat they were as awed as any to see the precision to detail implemented by Malibu engineers.

“It should have taken them years to execute something of that magnitude. Malibu did it in less than a year. Malibu has the most talent-

1972 Corvette ZR1 - The Rarest of all Small-Block Chevy Corvettes

Most Corvette enthusiasts are familiar with the legendary L88 package which was essentially a collection of limited edition racing parts installed on the L71 427/435 hp engine. I would also say that most are not that familiar with the 1970-72 ZR1 package which essentially did the same with the LT-1 350 ci small block. Much rarer than the 216 L88s made the three years prior, only 53 ZR1 Corvettes were produced during the three year span making them the rarest of all Chevy small blocks. So its a pretty big deal when one shows up for sale like this 1972 Corvette ZR1 which was recently listed for sale on eBay.



Rumor has it the ZR1 RPO stood for Zora's Racer 1. There is no doubt that this special street racing package has Zora Arkus-Duntov's fingerprints all over it. As the successor to the L88 Corvette which ended production in 1969, the ZR1 package was built on top the L88 chassis utilizing the LT-1 small block. Like the L88s, the ZR1 package included the M22 Muncie Rockcrusher 4-speed heavy duty transmission, J56 heavy duty brakes, transistorized ignition, a special aluminum radiator and a special suspension that included heavy duty springs, shocks, brakes and stabilizer bars.

When the ZR1 was released in 1970, there was no fanfare, magazine comparisons or road tests like we see today. As the corporate ban on racing was still in effect, no promotion was given to a radio-delete street racer. But the back door was wide open, especially when Chevy's corporate brass were looking the other way. But word did get out to those

original color of Elkhart Green. Inside is the original saddle leather interior and like all 1970-72 Corvette ZR1's, this example is missing a radio as well as no power windows, power steering, rear window defroster or air conditioning.

The Corvette was recently relisted with a "buy it now" price of \$200,000 although offers are being accepted. The auction runs through June 28th, 2010. A premium price

in the know, and in 1970 25 of these special Corvettes were sold. Over the next two years, the \$1,010 ZR1 package would see another 28 more examples make it out into the wild for a total production run of just 53 Corvettes.

This 1972 Corvette ZR1 that showed up on eBay appears to be the real deal. Featuring its original engine, drive train, interior and having just 16,295 original miles on the odometer, the Corvette has the provenance of the original tank sticker and its originality was acknowledged by its peers by appearing in the 1999 Bloomington Gold Special Collection.

The Corvette was restored in the mid-1980's and was repainted with lacquer paint to its

for a premium car for sure, but with only 53 examples of the original as well as the success of the new C6 ZR1, I'm surprised we haven't seen more of these cars start showing up at auction.


