



# 2014 Chevrolet Corvette: First Prototype Caught Testing in Canada

he Corvette is the very definition of a halo car, and the fact that 2013 marks its sixtieth year in production is nothing short of a miracle. The seventh-generation Corvette is still a model year away, during which time Chevy plans to send off the C6 with a special edition 60th Anniversary 427 Convertible.

Spy photographers have caught a glimpse of the 2014 Corvette undergoing cold-weather testing in Canada. It's the first time that the seventh-generation Corvette has been spotted in public.

The heavily camouflaged prototype reveals a few minor details about the upcoming sports car. It will clearly retain the classic long-nose, short-deck configuration of its predecessors, but the profile of the car will feature a more distinct wedge shape. Comparing profile shots of this prototype with the C6, it's apparent that the front wheels have moved farther forward, increasing the dash-to-axle ratio and likely the wheelbase. The rear end also appears to be larger, with a higher deck lid and slightly longer overhang. It also ap-

pears that this prototype's side mirrors are a different shape than the C6's, and its dual tailpipes are positioned closer together to form a perfectly spaced line of four pipes.

There's no evidence of a split rear window and a mid-engine layout is clearly not in the cards. These photos should put those wild rumors to rest, but what's under the hood and how the interior has been improved are still unknowns.

Shooters on the scene described an exhaust note that was most definitely of the V8 variety. Although an earlier report suggested that a small-displacement turbocharged V8 might be used, the sound of this prototype was more in line with a more typical normally aspirated, large-displacement V8. Most speculation suggests that this Corvette with get a roughly 5.5-liter V8 that uses direct injection and variable valve timing to develop around 500 horsepower. There are also reports that the C7 Corvette will feature a seven-speed manual transmission.

The official unveil of the 2014 Chevrolet Corvette is expected at next years North American International Auto Show in Detroit in January 2013.

## Retro Futuristic 1959 Corvette

ow often do we get the opportunity to have help in imagining a Corvette of the future? Well, certainly, we have reported much speculation on the C7, and we are still hungry for pictures of the real deal. But what if we specifically took a Corvette of the past, and imagined it into the future?

Former design studio manager at General Motors Brasil, Nelson Barros, who has had more than 30 years of experience in the auto industry, recently sent CarBodyDesign some very interesting design sketches. Barros, who worked for GM from 1969 to 2006 created a series of futuristic concept interpretations based on classic cars from the 20th century.



Using his talent and experience, Barros has given us a glimpse into the future with his concept drawings. The cars Barros chose to revisit were the Jaguar XK 120, 1950 Studebaker Commander, 1973 Ford Maverick, and 1959 Corvette.

Rarely is the future left untouched by the past. This is especially so when it comes to automobiles where brands,



makes, and models often carry with them strong former influences and features. It would appear Barros echoes this sentiment. Each design's for his future concepts rely heavily on the original models while injecting a futuristic twist. The Studebaker retains the iconic bullet nose grille it is known for, the Jaguar features the originals classic slim grille and stacked "V" shaped lights, the Ford Maverikck's muscular front end and imposing yellow and black paint job have made the modern jump, and of course there's the 1959 Corvette with its red-white livery and tapered chassis.



We have to admit we are impressed with Barros' work. The only model we are admittedly not crazy about is the Ford Maverick (it resembles too closely a modern Chevy Camaro). With the one exception, it's nice to see retirement hasn't diminished Barro's talent one bit. While it would be nice to hold out for a real modern recreation of the classic Studebaker, the odds are that it'll probably never happen.

# 1960 JRG Special Corvette Racer Sells for \$88,878 at Bonhams Paris

his classic 1960 Corvette racer was sold February 2nd at the Bonhams Paris sale. It is a sister car to the cars that ran Le Mans in 1960. The gold-with-red-stripes racer owned by Corvette author and enthusiast Tom Falconer changed hands for €67,850 with all fees. That's \$88,878 to you and me.

Falconer wrote 'Original Corvette 1953-1962' and is Judging Chairman of the UK Chapter of the NCRS.

The JRG Special began its career in the 1960s with an owner from Long Island, New York. The hard top-only Corvette represents SCCA B-Production cars of that time. Modifications were minimal with just the bumpers and hubcaps removed. After its road racing career ended it was converted over for drag racing duty.



Bernie Chodosh found the car in 1989 laying in a back yard in Long Island. The rear fenders had been cut to make way for some sticky drag slicks. Only the roll-bar remained to hint at this car's racing past. The hard top was long gone.

Bernie and Tom planned the restoration during a conversation about a hardtop Falconer had recently purchased. Tom generated a rendering of the finished car in felt-tip pen and crayon. From there plans were set forth to transport the JRG racer from New York across the Atlantic Ocean to Kent, England. The 12-month restoration yielded a period-correct race car. They added reinforcing gussets to the chassis as were recommended in GM's performance leaflets. Speculation is that one Zora Arkus-Duntov created these documents. The suspension is stock but now also sports some period gusseting and racing caster settings. The brakes are period heavy-duty drums, with vents drilled for cooling. The original steel wheels are finished in Roman Red, in lieu of the pricier Halibrand wheels found on the Le Mans cars. The 370hp cast iron 283ci was tuned by race engine specialist Gary Steffens.

The JRG special made its debut at Goodwood on March 3rd 2007 where it gained its FIA papers. It has since been campaigned by Chodosh and John Young in various historic and endurance events at Le Mans, Spa, Silverstone, Brands Hatch, and Snetterton.

In 2011 it was brought up to UK road specifications including legal lighting and a second race seat. The co-pilot's chair allows it to qualify for international road endurance events. It also passed the UK's roadworthiness test in December. In addition, the drivetrain has been refreshed with a new clutch and flywheel and a slightly quieter road exhaust.

The pre-auction estimate was €55,000 to €65,000 and the final bid fell right inside that range. The total price including commission was €67,850 which converts to just under \$89,000. We don't know where the JRG Special's new home is located, but we hope the new owner will continue to drive and race this unique piece of Corvette history.

## Lansing Area Quarter Midget Racing

elcome to CQMA – the capitol quarter midget club located in Lansing Michigan.

Quarter Midget racing is a form of automobile racing for kids. The cars are approximately one guarter (1/4) the size of a full size midget car. A guarter midget track is typically 1/20th of a mile in length, and has a surface of dirt, concrete, or asphalt. Current upper class guarter midgets can exceed 50 miles per hour, but remain safe due to the limited size of the track and strong roll cage designs. Unlike Go-Karts, Quarter Midgets feature full four wheel independent suspension and full roll cages. All specifications are closely set by the national governing board and enforced at each local club race by officials. The drivers are typically are of age 5 to 16. However, the entire family is involved in putting on the race day activities. The race events are put on by the membership within the club. All positions are voluntary. Flagging, corner workers, race scorers, pit stewarding, and even the concession stands are all run by the membership. Sponsorship is always welcomed and greatly appreciated.

Quarter Midgets have been around in one form or another since before World War II. Quarter Midget

racing is now held in virtually all 50 continental United States and in Canada. There were over 4,000 drivers in the United States in 2007. Quarter Midget racing is a family oriented sport that involves racing in specially prepared cars. The cars, rules and safety procedures are designed specifically for kids. The cars, full roll cages, racing clothing, helmets, gloves, neck braces, safety belts, arm restraints, mechanical components, etc. are covered by National safety rules. There are many brands of cars as well as custom cars made by individuals. Many second-hand cars in good condition can be found and are perfect for starter cars. The costs can run from \$1500 for an older used car, to nearly \$6000 for a brand new car set up for the upper, faster classes. Stock motors range in price from below \$500 to well over \$3000 for a motor depending on class and preparation. Tires start at \$50 a tire.

The CAPITOL QUARTER MIDGET ASSOCIATION has existed in Lansing, Michigan since 1959 and has provided many decades of family fun. The Track is located behind Rookies Restaurant and Bar at 16460 S Hwy 27, Lansing, Mi 48906. (It is about 3 miles south of

the I-69 and Old US-27 interchange. From Downtown Lansing, it is approximately 3 to 3 1/2 miles north on Larch Street ). The whole family is invited to get very involved with dad as Crew Chief and Mechanic, mom working in the Tower helping score races, and big brothers and sisters working in the snack bar. Lots of little brothers, sisters and racers can be found playing all day around the traak, in the race-car trailers and motorhomes. We typically race on Saturdays and some Friday Nights. There is also a National series taking place all over the country if so desired.

Even though it is competitive, families have become involved for the following reasons:



- It's a family sport all races are staffed and run by family volunteers from local tracks.
- Drivers develop physical skills such as coordination, timing, alertness, basic mechanical theory.
- Internal strength is developed through sportsmanship, self-reliance, accomplishment and recognition.
- It can be as big or a small as desired (i.e. just local racing or National touring)
- It's just plain fun!

You are welcome to visit their track, meet the members and racers, and watch a race. Our track has a detailed website with a lot of good information. Also, our club has a training program where your child can actually learn the rules and how to drive the car before ever being placed in a competitive situation. These



programs are HIGHLY recommended - for your child's safety and the safety of other drivers on race day. We can even rent/provide all equipment needed for training, so you can check out the sport without investing a lot of your own money. Many of today's most recognizable names in racing got their start in quarter midgets including; A.J. Foyt, Jeff Gordon, Sarah Fisher, Jimmy Vasser, Joey Logano, Brad Keselowski, Terry Labonte, and Bobby Labonte to name a few.



No club members other than those listed above were present for the meeting.


