NEW BUSINESS:


The board welcomed the newly elected board members. Rick had questions about the newsletter and ads and a discussion followed.

Preparing Your Corvette for Winter Storage

- Wash, dry and wax
- Change oil & filter
- Check the minimum freeze temperature of antifreeze and windshield washer fluid.
- Place a Vinyl tarp on the garage floor under Corvette, even if cement. Moisture rises from the floor and the tarp will prevent some of this moisture from getting to your undercarriage.
- Inflate tires to about 45 PSI and position tires on thick carpet pieces.
- Add a good gas stabilizer and fill gas tank to minimize water absorption.
- Attach a Battery Tender. No need to remove or disconnect your battery, this method retains all computer memories.
- Hang or place mothballs in porous containers under the hood to discourage mice or small rodents who like to chew on hoses and spark plug wires. Nylon footies or cut off old panty hose works well.
- Place fabric softener sheets in foot wells and rear area. Not sure how well this deters mice, but the car sure smells nice in the spring.
- For CONVERTIBLES: Unhitch the top latches so that the top does not "stretch" all winter.
- Remove any freezable items in your storage compartments and console.
- Cover the ends of the exhaust pipes to prevent any rodents from taking up winter residence. Tupper ware covers or steel wool works good.
- Put on a good quality Car Cover.
- It's good idea to start your vette every couple of weeks and run until engine reaches temperature. This may not be necessary, but sure is enjoyable. Open garage door slightly to expel exhaust fumes.

Why C7 Front Wheels Hop When You Turn Slowly

You may think it has something to do with your summer tires, but according to the GM experts, it is something else. It's called the 'Ackermann Effect' and the effect has been known for quite a while, dating back to horse and wagon days. Here's a link to the explanation:

It is a result of the inside and outside front wheels rotating at different speeds in a slow turn. Essentially the outside wheels are traveling further, creating a skipping or jumping effect. There is a design solution patented by Rudolph Ackermann in 1818. However, General Motors Corvette engineers decided that a tight turning radius is more important than eliminating the Ackermann Effect. Therefore, no worries, enjoy the excellent handling of your corvette.

CORVETTE TRIVIA

In its inaugural year, the 1990 Corvette ZR-1 was a \$27,016 option installed into 3,032 vehicles.

Corvette debuted in 1953 with a single available engine, the 235-cu in "Blue Flame" 6-cylinder powerplant, rated at 150 hp.

Part of the 1963 Corvette ZO6s package was a 36.5 gallon fuel tank, which consumed part of the rear interior cargo area and was hidden with a plastic cover.

Chevy offered a wide range of rear axle ratios for the 1967 Corvette, from a stump-pulling 4.56:1 to a freeway friendly 3.08:1 gear set.

Model year 1982 was another year of Corvette firsts and lasts. This year introduced Cross-Fire injection, replacing conventional carburetors. And 1982 was the last year that the chassis that debuted in 1963 was used.

When the 1957 Corvette debuted, a new option was available: Posi-traction. This was Chevy's limited-slip differential, and it helped maintain traction on slippery surfaces.

The 1969 Corvette L88 Roadster was missing something that 'normal' Corvettes wore: a radio antenna. Radios were not installed in L88s, as there was no ignition shielding on the engine.

In 1969, the L88 engine option was rare, expensive, and brutally strong. Only 116 Corvettes were given the powerplant, at a cost of \$1,032.15. Power was north of 500 horsepower.

Any transmission was available in the 1990 Corvette ZR-1, as long as it was the MN-6, six-speed manual box.

In an effort to convince the driving public that a top national speed limit of 55 mph was a good thing, the speedometer on America's Sports Car stopped at 85 mph. America didn't buy into it.

Chevrolet styling returned the Stingray name to the Corvette line in 1969, except it was now one word rather than two as seen during the C2 years.

Elkhart Green was the second most popular color on the 1972 Corvette, with 4,200 finished in this hue. Ontario Orange was the number one pick, with 4,891.

Besides the record production numbers, the 1979 model was also the first year the base coupe cost more than \$10,000, clocking in at \$10,220.

Rearward visibility was compromised in the C2s inaugural year, 1963. Police officers on motorcycles would shadow Corvette coupes by hiding behind the split in the rear window.

Nicknamed the "Coke Bottle" look, the pinched waist was a favorite styling element in the late 1960s Corvettes.

The Callaway twin turbo option also known as the Callaway Sledgehammer could be purchased for \$26,895.00 from 1987 to 1991. On October 26th, 1988 it was driven by Lingenfelter and would do 254.876 miles an hour.

Chevrolet's fifth-generation Corvette arrived with increases in both horsepower and civility, capped by 172-mph top speed.

On June 30th 1998, the first Corvette rolled off the assembly line in Flint, Michigan. Powered by a milquetoast 150-hp in-line six backed by a two-speed Power glide automatic transmission, the original Vette lacked the one key element that made later cars a success: horsepower.

Fans hoping for a topless variation on the fifth-generation Vette were no doubt disappointed when Chevrolet announced only a targa-top version for 1997. Devoted sun worshippers were forced to make do with the previous-generation Corvette for another year.
