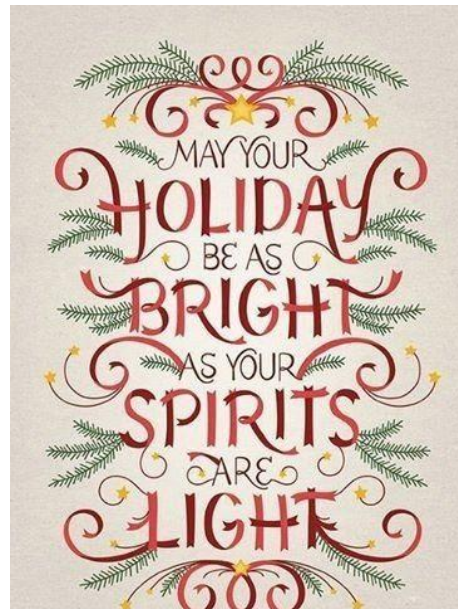

National Corvette Museum Ambassador Report 2018

The following information was shared during the recent ambassador convention held at the National Corvette Museum (NCM) on November 6 and 7, 2018. Detailed information about the museum can be found on their web site at www.corvettemuseum.org, or on their Facebook page.

Motorsports Park – To date nearly 25 million dollars have been invested in the Motorsports Park. All litigation associated with the park has been resolved. All weekends at the track have been booked for 2019 so if you intend to visit and wish to drive the track, either in their car or yours, you should plan a weekday visit. See the NCM web site “visit” link for Motorsports Park details and pricing. I will share that Sue and I had the opportunity to drive a couple laps of the track at speed in one of their C7s. I highly recommend it if you get a chance. It was awesome!

Executive Director – Wendel Strode will be retiring at the end of 2019. He has been the NCM’s only executive director. The NCM board has formed a search committee to find candidates to replace him.

NCM Expansion Plans- More storage space is needed for the approximately 80 vehicles that have been donated to the museum so far, with commitments of more to come. The need for more display and office space is also being considered in the long-term plans.

NCM Exhibits – Work is under way to refresh many of the displays at the NCM. This includes the Mobil Station, Dealership, Zora Area, St Louis Assembly, and Performance Gallery. The goal is to make these areas a bit more period correct, allow visitors to get a little closer to the automobiles if possible, and have the work completed by the 25th anniversary celebration in August of 2019. The Kid Zone has already been updated. Plans are also being finalized to add a “V8 story” display, some C7 updates to the Design/Engineering area, and some first and last Corvette examples to the Sky Dome. Speaking of exhibits, informative and educational exhibits such as the “V8 story” will be more common place in the NCM’s future. These exhibits are being designed to help better tell the evolution of the Corvette, the impact it had on Corvette’s competitors, and vice versa. These displays will include actual examples of these competitive vehicles from time to time. See the “explore” link on the NCM web page for more exhibit information.

25th Anniversary Celebration – The NCM’s 25th anniversary will be celebrated August 28th through the 31st, 2019. As with past major milestone anniversaries, there will be Corvette Caravans leaving all areas of the country converging on Bowling Green. 10,000 registrants are expected. In my opinion every Corvette owner should participate in one of these major anniversary celebrations once in their Corvette lifetimes. If you are considering attending, information can be found on the NCM’s web site under the “explore” link and/or by visiting www.corvettecaravan.com. Motel space will be limited, and you may have to look at availability in surrounding communities, so make sure you plan as early as possible.

NCM Events – All 2019 NCM events can be found under the “explore” link on the NCM web page. Some are already open for registration. In the future, because some of these events are purely social and don’t fall squarely under the NCM’s educational and research model mission statement, things like the Museum in Motion (MiM) events may one day be managed instead by an affiliated, yet separate organization or “enthusiasts” club. There was a lot of discussion about this at the ambassador convention and the NCM is taking those comments and concerns back the exploratory committee working on this topic.

Development & Donations - Museums are always looking for donations and the NCM is no different. Besides cash, the NCM also offers engraved bricks and benches, and printed parking lot banners for sale. The bricks and benches are permanent, the banners are displayed for one year only. A new way to donate is via club tables. For \$3000.00 the NCM will display your club’s logo for three years on a table top in the Café. Once the three years are up, your club gets to

keep the table top. 18 tables are available, one has already been sold. The NCM is a registered non-profit so all those types of tax advantages apply. You can find more information under the “support” link on the NCM web site.

NCM Membership – There are several types of memberships offered by the NCM. Benefits and costs are shown under the NCM website “support” link. Currently the NCM has 35,691 active members with about 4,000 of those being lifetime members.

Delivery Program – Under the “visit” link of the NCM web site you can learn about the various delivery and engine build programs the museum has to offer and their costs. This includes a program I was unaware of that allows you to have your pre-owned Corvette detailed and delivered at the NCM just like a new one would be. There is no information yet on when the assembly plant will re-open for tours but if you purchased an NCM delivery experience you will get your time in the plant once it does open again.

NCM Insurance - Several types of agreed value, collector car insurance policies are available to the public through the museum. You don’t need to be an NCM member to purchase a policy though you do get a discount if you are. Discounts apply for members of other organizations as well. Your car doesn’t need to be a Corvette either. It does however need to be something considered collectible and something not driven daily. Agreed value means the value of your car never depreciates, as long as your policy doesn’t lapse. There are yearly mileage limitations to choose from, but unused miles do roll over to the following years. Select the “shop” link on the NCM website to get to the NCM Insurance page.

NCM Misc. – Other information about educational programs, the Corvette store, club visits, build sheets, window stickers, bricks, and general NCM admission hours and prices are available via various links on the NCM web site.

Assembly Plant Update – Currently, as previously mentioned, the plant is not yet open for tours, and no date for a re-opening has been announced. Due to feedback from workers the plant is now running an 8 hour shift 5 days a week vs the 10 hour per day, 4 day per week schedule it previously ran. This should give an extra day for tours each week once the plant re-opens. Kai Spande, the Assembly Plant Director told us the plant is currently producing 93 Corvettes per day. Year to date it has produced 1259 of the 2019 model year ZR1’s which is about 40 per week. 40% of them have been Sebring Orange, 70% were ordered with the high wing. They had anticipated only 30% high wing when they introduced the ZR1. The ZR1 has 2990 total parts, (they count outsourced assemblies like the engine and transmission as one part in an assembly plant) which is 632 more parts than the base model Corvette. Also, 70% of all new Corvettes are ordered with the manual transmission. The new paint shop is now on line. At 1 million square feet it is four times larger than the old paint shop. It has 43 robotic paint arms vs the old 25, plus 6 additional robotic wet sanders. Wet sanding was previously done by hand. Using a powdered limestone reclaim system instead of a water- based sludge to reclaim and recycle paint has netted a 2 to 3 million dollar per year savings in the paint department. Hundreds of millions of gallons of water were being used to capture overspray paint in the old paint shop. It seems counter intuitive to introduce limestone dust into an area where you don’t want dirt of any kind, yet the positive gains this new system has on the local environment make the challenges well worth the effort. Development of a single new paint color results in about \$300,000 to \$400,000 in introduction costs. Did you know that Corvette is the only automobile in its class to have its nose fascia painted in house?
