



- Thank you, Simon and Gloria, for organizing the trip to the Marshall Memorial Day Parade.
- Thank you, Casey, for setting up a meeting place for traveling to the Turkeyville Car Show.

- The books are balanced and the bills are paid.
- We have enough in the checking account for the NCM membership payment.

V/P Governor:

Simon Reiffer

- Gloria and I had a great time at the convention.
- Currently NCCC has 17,817 members and 234 clubs. 59 members joined through NCM deliveries.
- Officers up for election this year are President, VP of Membership, Treasurer and Public Relations. Applications are due by September 13.
- There were 278 registered attendees at the 2024 Convention in Joplin, MO. Next year the convention will be in the Wisconsin Dells from August 17-22, 2025. There are plans for the 2026 convention to be held in Syracuse, NY. The 2023 convention in Bowling Green had 735 adult and 13 youth registrations with 108-day passes.
- There haven't been any new insurance claims. Allen Morris is looking into setting up a Business Plan for NCCC.
- Standing Rule Change Request (SR-2024-002) was passed. This rule now reads "In extraordinary nationwide circumstances the Executive Board may suspend the upcoming national meeting and/or convention."
- By-Law Change Request (BL-2024-001) was tabled. NCCC is looking at combining the positions of Charity and Sponsorship into one to align with current operating practices.
- Standing Rule Change Request (SR-2024-004) to address an increase in dues was not brought to the floor. Governors were asked to discuss ways to cut costs with their clubs and then share at the September meeting. Lowering the paper quality for Blue Bars is being looked at to help cut costs. Elaine doesn't believe members are ready to go 100% digital yet but encourages members who do not want the hard copies to switch to soft copies, available through the NCCC website.
- If you are thinking about becoming a Lifetime Member of NCCC, now is the time to do it. Lifetime membership is \$300 so you break even after 10 years. This may be increased to \$350. Lifetime membership in NCCC transfers between affiliated clubs if you move.
- Ten scholarships were given out at convention.

- The monthly message from the President went out to 13,200 members and only had 13 bad email addresses. There has been a problem Go Daddy not forwarding to emails. If you recently sent an email to an officer, they may not have received it. This issue has been fixed since the Governor's meeting.
- The FCOA page has been updated and Melissa Felts has been posting monthly newsletters for the members.

Lake Michigan Circle Tour

The first week of June Michelle and I travelled to the Wisconsin Dell's for Corvette Adventures, but rather than taking the most direct route to get there, we drove the northern part of the Lake Michigan Circle Tour. Our trip began on Saturday with us heading west to Muskegon where we picked up Scenic Dr. and started our journey north along the lake shore. Our first stop was at Silver Lake for a Mac Wood's Dune ride. After a fun adventure on the dunes we made a stop in Pentwater for lunch and then picked up M22 just north of Manistee. We traveled the entire length of M22, with a stop in Glen Arbor at Boonedocks for dinner, before making the loop thru the Leelanau Peninsula up to Northport and then to Traverse City. We spent the night in Traverse City and on Sunday enjoyed some time on Grand Traverse Bay and went back to Glen Arbor for dinner at Cherry Republic and to hike the Empire Bluff Trail as well as the trail up to Pyramid Point. Monday we continued our journey around the lake. Heading north on US31 we made a quick stop to visit Tom's aunt in Petoskey before picking up M119 going thru the Tunnel of Trees. After crossing the Mighty Mac we stopped in Saint Ignace for a burger at Clyde's Drive-In then continued our journey thru the UP on US2. In Escanaba (it was too early to see it in the moon light and lightly raining) we picked up US41 south. In Menominee we made a short stop at John Henes Park for some nice views of Green Bay, before crossing the border into Wisconsin and completing our days drive. Tuesday we started our day in Green Bay, WI with a Lambeau Field Stadium tour and visited the Packers Hall of Fame. After lunch we headed north on W57 into the Door County Peninsula, and drove all the way to the tip of the peninsula, including a cruise down the curvy road. After a stop for ice cream we headed south again on W42 and completed the day's drive in Sheboygan, WI. and had dinner at Parker John's BBQ & Pizza followed by a walk on the beach. Wednesday morning we drove to Acuity Insurance to see the tallest flag pole in North America. (Standing 400 ft Tall, 11 ft in diameter at the base, and flying an American Flag measuring 70 ft X 140 ft) From there it was on to get some fresh Wisconsin cheese curd at the Gibbsville Cheese Factory. Nothing quite like fresh warm curd and the squeaky sound in makes on our teeth. Our final stop before completing our trip to the Wisconsin Dells was a stop at the International Crane Foundation in Baraboo, WI. There we learned that there are 15 different cranes in the world, but only two that live in North America. (Whooping Crane & Sandhill Crane) They have all 15 species of Cranes at the Foundation for you to see and learn about. Upon arriving in Wisconsin Dells our odometer had recorded 1173 miles since we left home and we had a great time. If you ever get a chance to drive all or part of the Lake Michigan Circle Tour we would definitely recommend that you give it a go and enjoy the beautiful scenery.



Corvette Adventures

Corvette Adventures is a three day annual event which takes place in the Wisconsin Dells and surrounding country side. Each day you have a choice of guided Corvette driving tours to take and other events as well. The tour we chose on the first day took us on a 244 mile drive thru the country side making stops at the Ziegler Winery in Fond du Lac, lunch at Fudgienuckles Sports Pub in Glenbeulah, followed by a tour of Throttlestop to see the cars & motorcycles in their collection before returning to the Dells. Day two took us on a 110 mile drive and included a 3 hour visit at The House on the Rock in Wyoming, WI. This bizarre house filled with an unbelievable array of collections is hard to describe and something you will have experience firsthand to believe.
