 No additions or corrections were made to the March minutes. Motion to approve: Tom Faupel, seconded by Simon Reiffer, and approved by the majority of the membership in attendance.

Treasurer: James Sutherland

 James was not able to attend the meeting, but reported that all bills are paid and the books are balanced.

V/P Governor: Simon Reiffer

- Simon stated that we should include our NCCC number when we register for events so that the points are properly awarded to the individual and their respective club.
- Simon shared the voting he had passed on to George Duncan, the National Parliamentarian, regarding how to reduce NCCC operating budget deficit for 2025. Simon's voting reflected the results of the surveys that club members had completed. This included:
 - o Eliminating two of the national in-person governor meetings per year.
 - Deleting the regional rebate awards.
 - Change Blue Bars to an online publication only.
 - Stop printing annual membership cards.
 - Pass a moderate increase in membership dues in the amount of \$15.00 for primary and \$10.00 for spouse.
 - No additional fees charged for participating in national sanctioned events.
 - Allowing at large membership registration with credit card payment available to new members.
 - o Members felt that they get good benefits.
 - Seek volunteers to explore ways to advertise/market NCCC to increase membership.
 - Maybe seek a professional to improve the website.
 - Seek a volunteer with experience to help reduce operating expenses and streamline processes.
 - Seek volunteers to write technical articles for Blue Bars.
 - NCCC should seek bids on outsourced expenses.




