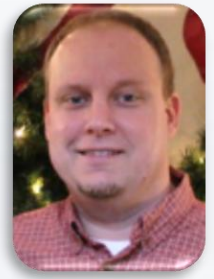

As we close out the year, this will be my last newsletter as President, at least for now. I may serve again someday, but for now, it's time for a break and a new perspective as your Governor. I'm not going far, just shifting into a role that aligns with my current energy.

When I first became President, my focus was on our local scene: events, car shows, and doing whatever was necessary to keep everything running smoothly. Over time, that scope widened. I found myself working more with the Michigan Region, volunteering with the Competition Committee, and eventually participating in national discussions shaping NCCC's future. Representing our club at that level, helping guide decisions, and being the voice that carries our message forward is something I'm proud to do.

Passing on what we've learned matters. The future will be built by the next group of leaders, and we owe it to them to keep building something worth inheriting.

- No additions or corrections were made to the October minutes. Motion to approve: Tom Faupel, seconded by Bob Maynard, and approved by the majority of the membership in attendance.

- All bills are paid and the books are balanced.
- The net proceeds from the Shaheen show have been finalized and a check will be delivered to the Davies Project.

V/P Governor: Simon Reiffer

- The National Governor's meeting will be in St Louis on 14-15 Nov.
- The minutes for the September National Governor's meeting are now posted on the Member's Only Page of the website.
- The National Convention will be in Syracuse, NY. Registration begins on Feb 1, 2026. The event will include both high speed and low speed events, as well as drag races.
- The Regional Meeting will be next Tuesday.
- Simon will be voting in favor of all of the proposed rule book changes.
- Gloria has updated the club's website by adding past newsletters dating back to 1992.

- All points are up to date, with the exception of the Color Tour and last Saturday's event.

Competition Director: Kevin Mead

- Kevin was unable to attend, but reported through Kyle that he is working with Birch Run to establish possible dates for our low-speed event for 2026. The Blessings Car Show is scheduled for June 13th, 2026.

- The club currently has 94 members, 2 honorary members, and 23 FCOA.

- Nothing new to Report.

Membership Meeting Minutes

- Elaine Herreta requested articles for Blue Bars. Basically, if you've had a problem with your Corvette, and figured out how to fix it, submit a tech article to Blue Bars.
- 2026 scholarship applications open on January 1 and close on May 15. There were 36 applicants in 2025 with 27 of them complete. Eight scholarships were given out.
 - Walt Jenkins requested that he be informed of all new Lifetime members so that he can connect the points in the database since they would have an LM added to their membership number after upgrading.
- FCOA has 1,006 members; 44 new since January; 106 aged out.
- National awards were presented as follows:
 - Roger Clancy Humanitarian Award – Dave and Joan Heinemann
 - President's Award – Craig Kamradt
- Roll call for dues increase passed by 192 yes and 39 no (I think). Primary increased by \$15; Spouse Companion by \$5; Youth Dependent by \$5; Lifetime by \$200.
- 2025 convention reports were given. 395 attendees for the full week; 26 day passes; 1 youth; and worker passes were reinstated. Excess money will be split between the hosts and NCCC.
- The Regional Competition Directors met approximately 270 hours on Zoom and have put forth 11 rule changes and 7 new proposals to be voted on in November.
- Cost cutting items being discussed include dropping one meeting per year in St. Louis and dropping the annual membership cards, going to electronic cards only.

- Kyle provided a summary of accomplishments during his tenure as president:

This will be my last meeting as President, at least for this stint. I may end up doing it again someday, but right now it's time for a short break and a new perspective as your Governor. Don't worry — I'm not going far, just moving one seat over.

When I first became President, most of my focus was on our local activities — hosting, organizing, and doing everything I could to help our events run smoothly. Over time, my involvement grew beyond our own lot and into the regional and national side of NCCC. Our longtime Governor has served this club with dedication for many years, and out of respect, I never wanted to run against him. When he decided it was time to step down, I felt it was the right moment to make the transition. I was asked if I was ready, and I realized this new role — being the person who votes and represents our club to NCCC — fits perfectly with where my energy is today. It's a natural next step, and I'm proud to carry that responsibility forward.

Membership Meeting Minutes

Looking back, I'm proud of what we've accomplished together. We've kept our membership consistent, our events strong, and our energy steady. Our car shows have grown by about twenty percent, thanks in large part to the relationships we've built with other clubs. We've scored high in the Michigan Region, brought home multiple participation awards, and represented Capital City well at conventions and signature events. I'm also proud of the work I've done with the Competition Committee. Volunteering there has helped keep our club's name visible within NCCC, and the upcoming rulebook will include my name — and Capital City Corvette Club — in the credits. We've kept our legacy alive as a founding club, and that still means something.

Another thing I'm proud of is how we embraced technology. I introduced Zoom to Capital City, and we ran with it. That simple change helped more members participate when they couldn't attend in person — and it caught the attention of others. The Michigan Region adopted it, the Competition Committee began using it, and now people at the National Level are asking that we move to it for Governor's meetings. It's pretty neat to know something we started right here is helping others across the country stay connected and involved.

On a personal level, these last five years have been incredible. I think I've squeezed about as much out of NCCC as anyone possibly can. I've attended three conventions, held multiple offices at both the club and regional level, traveled to several states, and taken part in national meetings. More importantly, I've built friendships with people from all over the country. The saying "Came for the car and stayed for the people" couldn't be more true for me.

If I have one regret, it's that I didn't inspire more of our members to travel beyond our local events. There's a whole world of NCCC out there filled with fun, friendship, and competition that many never get to experience. Through Capital City, I learned how much those trips matter — Mackinaw, conventions, and smaller adventures with members who made the effort. Traveling builds bonds, changes your perspective, and connects you to the broader Corvette community in ways local events just can't. We just need more of our members to take those opportunities.

Looking ahead, I think we need to keep one thing in mind: perception is reality. Whether we like it or not, we're often seen as old, white, and grumpy, with too many rules. That's the stereotype we're up against. But every new face, every friendly conversation, every smile and wave helps change that. We can honor our traditions and still evolve — showing people that this club is fun, diverse, and welcoming to anyone who loves Corvettes.

And finally, we need to think long-term about the health of our club. To keep supporting our charities and hosting the events that make a difference, Capital City Corvette Club has to stay strong, relevant, and visible. That means bringing in new members, keeping people engaged, and passing along what we've learned — so that when some of us step back, there's always someone ready to take the wheel. Branding is a big part of that. People need to see us to know us, and the more visible we are, the more we can do — for charity, for new members, and for our community.

It's been an honor to serve as your President. Thank you for trusting me with the wheel, for showing up, for supporting our events, and for keeping this club moving forward. I've had a blast working with all of you, and I'm excited to keep helping in my new role.

Capital City Corvette Club Board Meeting Minutes November 19, 2025: Delhi Cafe & Zoom

6:30 Call to Order: Kyle Felts

- Mail received included a thank-you from the Davies Project and a solicitation from the Greater Lansing Food Bank, which will be voted on at the Christmas Party.
- Kyle recommends that a treasurer be appointed for large events, like the Shaheen show, as keeping track of all the funds can be difficult.

6:35 Board Reports:

Secretary: Tim Wells

- October Board minutes previously approved by email.

Treasurer: James Sutherland

- James was not at the meeting, but reported to Kyle that all bills are paid, and the books are balanced. Money is also available for our annual giving.

V/P Governor: Simon Reiffer

- Simon was present via Zoom. Although he was unable to attend the November 15th Governors meeting in St. Louis, he summarized the report provided by Kathy Duncan, the Michigan Regional Executive. Full meeting minutes will be posted on NCCC's website in early 2026.

President: As a cost cutting measure, NCCC will be going to three Governor meetings starting in 2027. They will be looking to implement Zoom meetings as well.

National Corvette Museum Update: Deadline to get sweepstakes tickets from the museum for a 1967 Corvette is November 20, 2025 (tomorrow). The museum broke ground for a new collection room. The target for completion is fall 2026. The museum now has their own photographer in house. Plant tours will open in March 2026.

VP Competition: New rule changes and clarifications were passed and will take effect in 2026. Kyle will have more info on the National Competition Program.

Kyle's Comments:

- All the new competition rule changes were approved.
- Vehicles like SUVs, trucks, etc., will not be allowed for funkhanas. However, it was approved to do funkhanas indoors during inclement weather.
- There will be a new Economy Event that will be based upon miles per gallon.
- Vette Karts will be allowed in competition events. Vette Karts are stripped down C4-C8 Corvettes and will compete in either raceprep or raceprep altered, depending upon whether or not a roll cage has been added.

Board Meeting Minutes

VP Membership: As of November 2025, the total membership count is 16,444. As expected, some clubs dropped as a result of the dues increase. The membership data base will be closed down December 15 for updates. The only Kentucky club asked to be moved into the Southeast Region, from the Indiana Region. The request was approved and will take effect on January 1, 2026.

New membership cards will be sent out early 2026. Please don't throw them away. You will not get another one for 2026. Membership cards may be printed from the NCCC website. Lifetime cards will also be mailed out in early 2026 for the new lifetime members. Make sure you look at the back of the membership cards for a current list of NCCC sponsors for discounts. Tell them you are a member of NCCC.

Secretary: The new NCCC secretary is Rita Robinson. She was secretary prior to Ellen.

Treasurer: The NCCC balance as of November 13, 2025 was reported. The 2025 Convention made over \$14,000 which will be split between NCCC and Midwest Region.

157 members took advantage of the lifetime fire sale before the dues increase resulting in a cash overflow. This will go onto the balance sheet as deferred income and spread out in distributions over 10 years.

Business Manager: The new NCCC Business manager is Jeanne Castle. The hotel budget proposal will be reviewed in February and signed in May. Insurance continues to be our largest expense. There were no new claims for speed events in 2025. Three non-competition claims were paid out. Reminder to keep signed waivers.

The 2026 NCCC convention is planned for June 20-27 in Syracuse, NY. Conventions in the planning stages: Bowling Green, KY (2027); Waco, TX (July 17-23, 2028); and Denver, CO (2029).

Parliamentarian: By-law and standing rule proposals are being discussed, rewritten and reviewed by the RE's. Now that a cost cutting measure has been voted in by the Governors, the number should decrease.

Public Relations: NCCC runs an ad in the NCRS magazines and they reciprocated with an ad in Blue Bars. Anyone interested in hosting a booth to promote NCCC can contact Jeff Bruggeman for supplies. Rene Cardenas has been added to the social media team. They are getting infrastructure in place for the NCCC YouTube page.

Editor: Anyone may write and submit an article to be published in Blue Bars. The next deadline is November 30. Elaine gave a reminder that the NCCC Facebook page is only for NCCC Members. Please DO NOT invite your friends to join if they do not belong to NCCC. If you put in a request to join, you MUST answer the questions and agree to all the rules. This is a private group.

Sponsorships and Charities: NCCC scholarship applications open on January 1 and close May 15, 2026.

There will be four St. Jude raffles in 2026. Gift baskets will be raffled off at the 2026 convention. If anyone would like to donate items for the baskets please contact Michele Cantelmo.

Michele is putting together a committee to network for additional sponsorship. Let her know if you have any possible leads so she can speak with them about NCCC.
