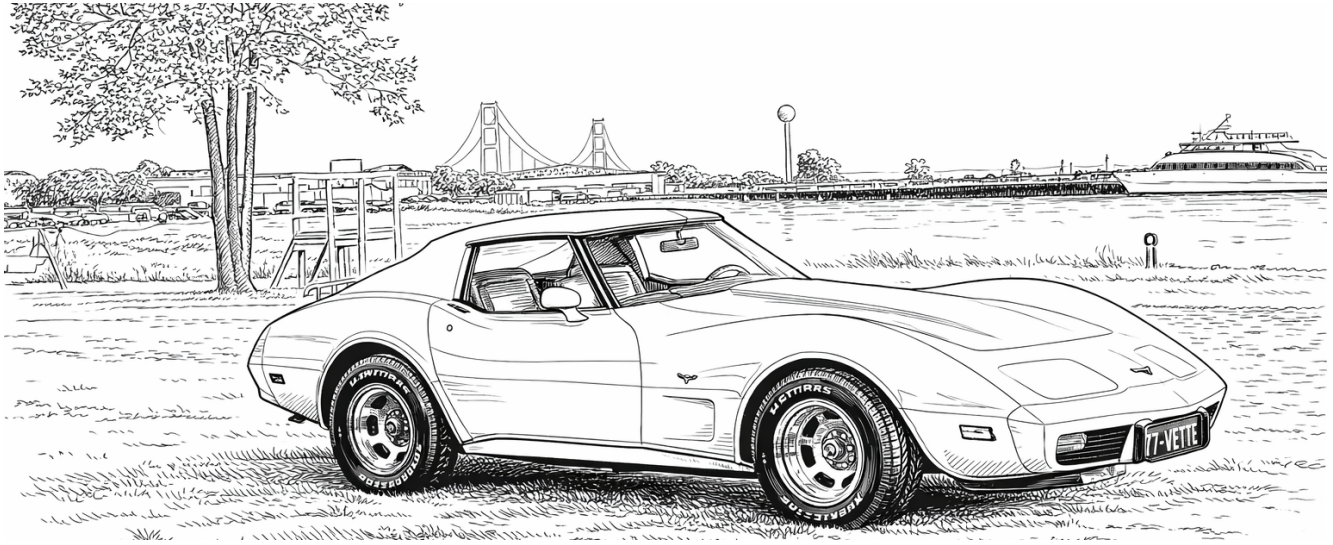

Member Perspective – What Capital City Corvette Club Has Meant to Us

Simon and I joined Capital City Corvette Club in May of 1994, just a year after buying our 1977 Corvette. We were immediately drawn to the social side of the club and especially loved the drive-and-dines, car shows, rallies, and the low-speed events at Spartan Speedway. Before long, we were planning our vacations around the annual Spring Fling and Corvette Crossroads, building friendships that have lasted more than three decades.



In 2000, CCCC hosted the NCCC Convention at Shanty Creek Resort. Because we had been youth leaders in our church, we volunteered to help with the youth program. We took the kids canoeing, hosted a picnic with games and a bonfire at a nearby ski lodge, and organized movie and game nights so their parents could enjoy the evening festivities. We have now attended twenty NCCC conventions across the United States – each one filled with cherished memories. (The next NCCC Convention will take place in Bowling Green, KY from July 17-23, 2027. Make plans to attend with us!)

By 2002, our involvement deepened. Simon was elected Public Relations Director, and I became Social Director. That same year, I built the club website, which brought in many new members who hadn't previously known that CCCC existed. We were fully immersed – attending events, helping wherever needed, and enjoying the friendships that had become central to our lives.

Everything changed for us on June 7, 2003. Simon fell from the second rung of a ladder while preparing to clean the gutters. That short fall broke his back and left him paralyzed from the waist down. CCCC members rushed to Sparrow Hospital to see what they could do to help. Only immediate family were allowed in the Neuro ICU, but several of the guys got in by simply saying they were Simon's brother. Simon

remembers nothing from that first week, but their compassion carried me through those terrifying hours, the following two months he spent at Sparrow, and then another month at home confined to full-body brace in a hospital bed the majority of the time.

The true spirit of the Corvette community revealed itself in the months that followed. Friends from the club and our church took turns staying with Simon during the day so I could return to work full time. Once he began therapy, they drove him to appointments until he was strong enough to drive on his own with hand controls.

That summer, close friends from Jackson Corvette Club installed central air in our home – at cost – so that Simon wouldn't come home to unbearable summer heat while in the body brace. A friend from the Michigan Autocross Group donated a cruise control transducer for our Corvette. JCC members installed it and modified donated hand controls so that Simon could drive his Corvette again. They also designed and installed a trailer hitch so that we could pull a trailer or hang his wheelchair off the back. Craig Iansiti hosted a Tech Tuesday to install new mufflers on our Corvette. Craig and Gordy's hands got filthy while Simon's stayed perfectly clean.



One Saturday morning, a large group of club members tackled projects around our home that had been neglected during Simon's hospitalization and recovery. They painted door jambs, organized the garage and shed, weeded and mulched the flower beds, etc. They even got his father's old scooter running – giving Simon mobility in our neighborhood and community.

With Simon unable to return to his job at the Meijer Warehouse, our income dropped drastically. Club members stepped in and organized a fundraiser. The monies raised helped us transition through the loss of income while on short term disability until Simon was able to fully retire and receive his pension.

I can't begin to express how much everyone's friendship, and offers of assistance, has meant to us over the years. To this day, whenever we arrive at a car show or event, we are met with immediate offers to help unload the wheelchair and then pack it back in after the event. While each gesture may seem small, together they have meant everything to us. What a great group. What a great club. What a great family.

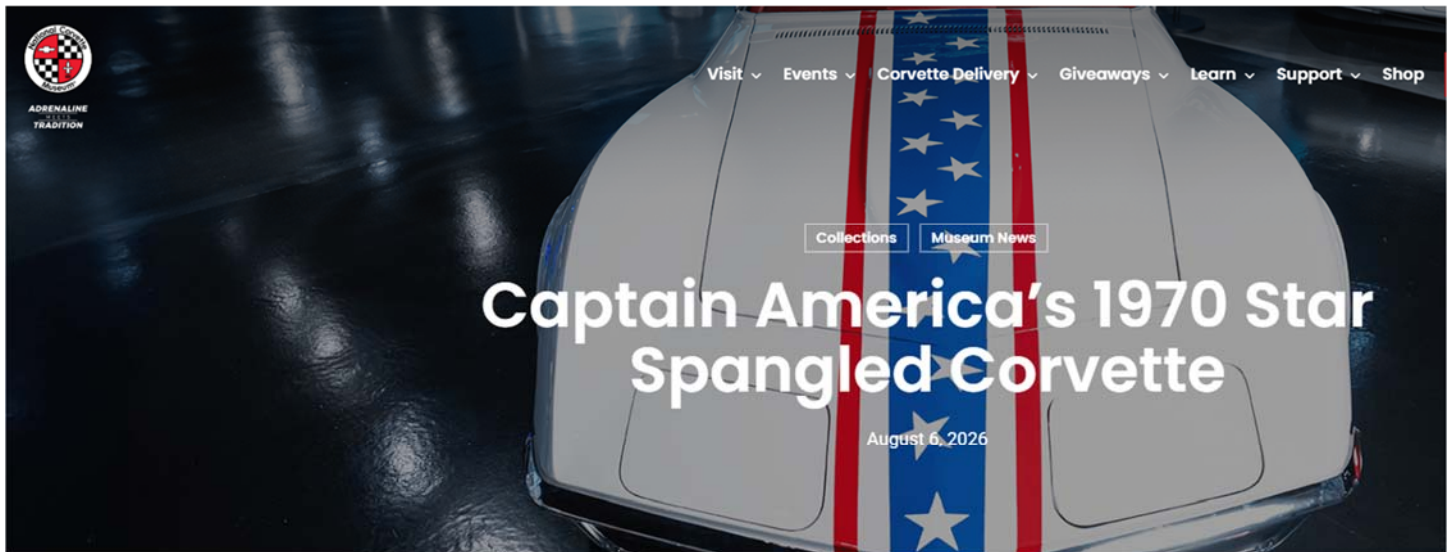
